The opening line of today's passage from Sirach says, "If you choose you can keep the commandments, they will save you." Notice the use of conditional conjunction "if" and the verb "choose." We have the power, if we choose to use it. However, when we avoid keeping the commandments, usually we blame it on human weakness,

temptation, or some intervention by the devil. But ultimately, we make the choice to either keep the commandments or fall into sin.

In the long version of today's Gospel passage, Jesus expands on the notion of what the commandments mean. Not only are they to be taken literally (i.e.,

"Thou shalt not kill"), but there is also a broader context (killing is not only physical; one can also kill someone's spirit with anger, criticism, or holding onto grudges). Sometimes, however, we become Pharisaical in our parsing of the commandments ("I never committed adultery with another person"). Yet, looking at pornography on the internet can

## ► How can I better follow-through with my yes?



*Let your 'Yes' mean 'Yes,' and your 'No' mean 'No.' Anything more is from the evil one.*

Matthew 5:37

As Catholic Christians, we have a specific set of beliefs that we recite together as a community every Sunday at Mass. Many of our brothers and sisters from other Christian denominations cannot state the same. The very first sentence is, "We believe in one God, the Father Almighty, Creator of Heaven and Earth." How often have we really thought about that one statement of belief and what it implies for our lives?

Our faith calls us to worship with our whole heart, with our whole mind, and with all of our strength. That requires a surrendering to God of our being, of our thoughts, our actions, and our choices. Do we fully believe that God gives us what we need, or have all the past hurts and disappointments in our life led us to distance ourselves from God? Bad things happen all the time. Sin exists, people have free will, and our choices are not always the best. We often forget that the choices we make can affect other people's lives. Praying for guidance and discernment is a vital part of the Christian way of life. We trust

in Christ and believe the words that He said, "I am the Way, the Truth, and the Life."

Through our prayer, God does answer. I have experienced it many times. But, the question remains, does the person praying have the patience to listen for God's answer? Are we trusting enough to accept the answer; are we strong enough to say "yes" to a calling from God and to follow through with that "yes?" Mary's "yes" was to a very challenging calling from God. She lived in a time where she could have been an outcast because of her "crazy lie," stoned for her apparent "infidelity," killed for her calling. However, God in His goodness granted the graces she would need to survive her calling, to birth us our Savior.

We each have a calling, the will of God. He asks us to trust in Him as He sends us on our journey to do His will and better this Earth. I challenge you to pray on what His calling is for you. Are you willing to find that out? To pray on it? To wait patiently for His response? To go where He calls you? The



first disciples left their friends, their family, and their work to follow Jesus. Without their "yes," Christianity would not have spread as it has. This world needs you and the calling He has given only to you. Pray on it and say "yes." Who knows what fruits your "yes" could bear.

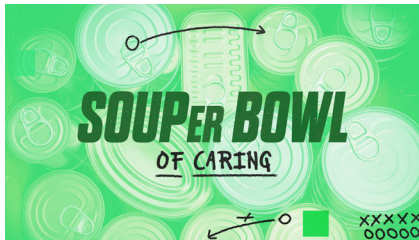

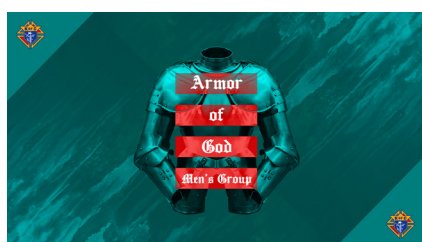

## What are the seven last words of Christ?

## ▶ Walking the Path

In one of our adult studies, a comment was made about different types of rosaries. The comment brought to mind, for me, several different topics. First of all, I thought about the time when Pope St. John Paul II developed a new set of Mysteries. I also thought about my “go to” rosary for prayer, “The Servite Rosary.” Then I thought about the many other forms of the rosary. This article will expand upon each of these concepts.



To begin, Pope St. John Paul II's introduction of the “Luminous Mysteries” in 2002 was a new idea for many Catholics. I had a number of people, at the time, who asked me if they needed a new set of rosary beads since the pope had made the “change.” I assured them that they didn't. The pope had proposed the Luminous Mysteries to “highlight the Christological character of the rosary.” These mysteries refer to “Christ's public ministry between his Baptism and his Passion,” the Holy Father explained in his

apostolic letter, *Rosarium Virginis Mariae*. It was a listing of mysteries that an individual could focus upon that the pope was giving, not an upheaval of the rosary itself. This list of mysteries would be added to the existing collection of mystery lists that were already being used by many pray-ers of the most common five decaderosary. The existing mysteries included the “Glorious Mysteries,” the “Sorrowful Mysteries,” and the “Joyful Mysteries,” so, now, individuals would have four different sets of events from Christ's



life to choose from while praying. I don't think it is a stretch to say that the five decade rosary is the most prayed rosary of any, and the one that comes to mind when thinking about this prayer form. It isn't, however, the only type of rosary.

Another somewhat popular rosary is the "Servite Rosary," which is sometimes called the "Servite Chaplet." I feel the term "rosary" is a better fit, since a "chaplet" is often prayers said while using a set of beads that are quite different from the most common arrangement of five sets of ten beads (with a few others near the cross, or placed between each set). The Servite Rosary is prayed using beads that are arranged with seven groups of seven beads (with others added, as just mentioned). If you choose to pray this type of rosary, as I often do, you would need this special arrangement of beads. In this prayer form, the "mysteries" of the other rosary are now called "weeks." Each week focuses on the Seven Sorrows of Mary. These are the times that Mary's "heart was pierced" in her role of being the mother of Jesus. Events like losing Jesus in the Temple or seeing Jesus carrying the cross are among this list of seven times that must have been so very difficult for her. As a mother myself, I connect with the emotions that she must have experienced, even though mine are a mere shadow of her experience. Praying the Servite Rosary has made me feel much more connected to her as my mother, and role model for all mothers.

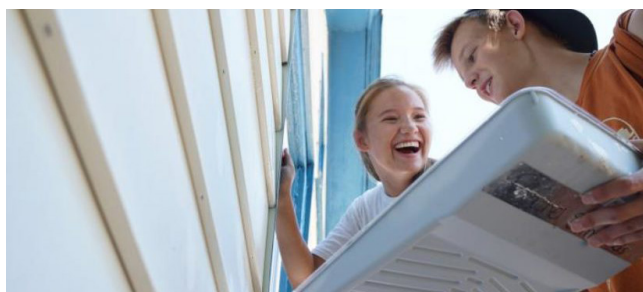
As I mentioned, these two ways to pray a "rosary" are not the only ones! The "Franciscan Crown" is a rosary of seven decades, so seven sets of ten. It focuses on the "Seven Joys" of Mary. Another rosary that is often called, simply, the "Franciscan Rosary" is a fifteen decade rosary that includes all fifteen mysteries that were in place prior to 2002. There are dozens, and dozens of other types of chaplets where the prayers said can differ. There are, also, tons of varieties of bead arrangements to make praying more convenient. Whether bracelets, rings, or any other form, these sacramentals (the term for objects that help us in prayer) are all great ways to include prayer in your life. Like Nike says, "Just do it!"
