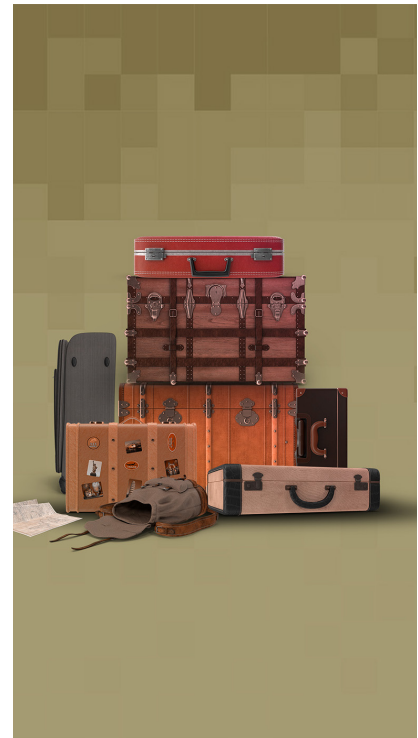
## ► What does it mean to be prepared?

When planning a vacation, I can't help but get excited once it's officially on the books. I find myself counting down the days in anticipation. From the time I pack to the minute I take off, I am constantly checking my destination's weather to ensure I have all the appropriate gear for the conditions ahead of me. Preparing for a vacation involves practical readiness.

We know that we should be prepared, and we hear this phrase all of the time, but what does it mean to "be prepared?" In reality, just like packing for a vacation, the answer is probably different for each of us. However, we should all plan ahead spiritually. Focusing on leading a righteous and virtuous life, keeping faith, and following the teachings of Jesus can create this spiritual and moral readiness.

The Gospel this weekend ultimately challenges us to be ready to meet the Lord when he comes again. In the Gospel, Jesus shares a parable about ten virgins who take

their lamps and go out to meet the bridegroom. Half of them are prepared with oil for their lamps, and half are not. When the bridegroom arrives, only the prepared virgins are welcomed into the feast. We must be prepared for him, as well. To me, being spiritually prepared is consistently following God's greatest commands: to love him and others. This means putting others first and being kind, thankful, and humble. God doesn't expect us to be perfect in this, but that's okay. As St. Paul reminds us, amid our imperfections and weaknesses, the Lord is present to strengthen and forgive us. He sustains us, leads us through dark valleys, and welcomes us into his wedding banquet with open arms to all. If we live our lives prepared and conscious of these commands, we'll be ready whenever he comes.

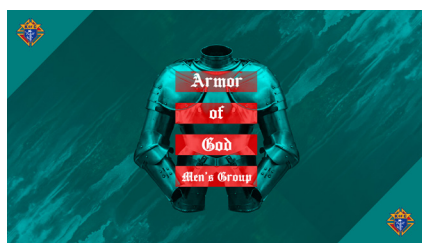

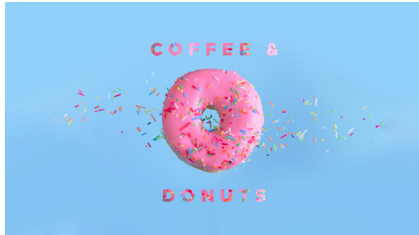

Thanksgiving is the time of the year when we enjoy the fruits of God's graciousness. Holiday traditions often include enjoying a homemade meal with loved ones. Each Thanksgiving holiday, St. Vincent de Paul, here at St. Therese of Lisieux, distributes a "Thanksgiving meal" in the form of a frozen turkey and gift cards to our neighbors in need. Last year,

we serviced approximately 25 families for Thanksgiving. This year, we anticipate a higher number of requests. With the inflation squeeze, it may be especially tough for those trying to make ends meet.

We are asking you—our parish community—for help with the following items:

## ► Walking the Path

Last week, I mentioned the value of consulting *The Catechism of the Catholic Church* when seeking information about the Church's teaching on a particular topic. I also mentioned that, most often, the *Catechism* provides summary statements about matters for which much more can be said. This week, I'd like to give additional context for both statements.

First of all, it is good to know that we have a "one-stop shop" for information and answers to many of our questions about the teachings of the Church, and *The Catechism of the Catholic Church* is that place. I feel, though, that I need to include a qualifier or two in this statement. Let me start by saying that the *Catechism* can't begin to include every facet of every topic, which can be problematic. The brief statements aren't meant to include descriptions of applications of the teaching or extenuating circumstances that could cause an exemption, or, or... These statements provide the foundation for other comments and teachings. They are pithy and concise but not necessarily meant to be the only thing that has been, or will be, said on a topic.

Now, don't get me wrong. *The Catechism* is a lovely text, filled with quotes from scripture, teachings from the early Church Fathers, and more. It is worth reading by all

Catholics, but it isn't meant to be a page-turner! If you choose to read it, I encourage you to view it more like a booklist or anthology. Reading it in small bits and researching for answers to the questions that come along the way can be helpful-if you have good sources of information. The first reliable source for explaining and clarifying the teachings would be "Fr. Mike Schmitz's Catechism in a Year Podcast." Available through the app store on your phone or YouTube, it is designed to clear up and explain the entire text. Another good place to go is to a reliable Catholic bookstore or publisher to see if they have any books on a particular topic. You'll need to be careful of what comes up when searching online, but reliable sources are out there (more on that topic soon). How do we know if a printed source is "reliable?" The first sign is if you find the marks of official approval in the form of a "nihil obstat" and/or an "imprimatur."

Authors can get this seal of approval through a two-part process. The review begins when an author submits the manuscript to the censor deputatus, who is someone appointed by the bishop, or other Church authority, to make such examinations. If the censor deputatus finds no doctrinal error in the work, he grants a nihil obstat. Translated as "nothing stands in the way," the nihil obstat indicates that the manuscript can be safely forwarded to the

bishop for his review and decision. Next, if the bishop agrees that the work is free from doctrinal error, he grants an imprimatur. From the Latin imprimere, meaning to impress or to stamp an imprint, imprimatur translates as "let it be printed." Technically, this is the bishop's official declaration that the book is free from doctrinal error and has been approved for publication by a censor. These markings are usually found, if present, on the "copyright page" of a publication, along with publication dates, publisher's information, and more. It is worth noting, however, that not every "Catholic" book has these markings, and their absence doesn't necessarily mean a book is "bad." When present, though, it means that the author has gone to the time and trouble to have their text reviewed by reliable authorities, and it has passed the test.

Taking time to stroll through the *Catechism*, seeking out additional information along the way, is a huge game-changer. These words aren't mine. They are those of many of my "Catechism in a Year" participants. They often say that "all Catholics should be reading this stuff," and I agree. If you haven't ever seen this treasure, go to the Vatican's website to read it, or better yet, get your hands on a copy. Read in small bites; it is a great way to understand more about the faith.



## ► How to be Grateful at Thanksgiving While Grieving

Have you experienced a loss recently (or even in the last year or two) and are still having a hard time feeling happy or even grateful? Wondering how you will get through the holidays because you just don't feel like celebrating?

The holidays are hard for different people for many other reasons, but being with people who are happy and excited about the holidays might be something you are wondering if you want to participate in. You might ask yourself, "Why should I be grateful when I have lost so much?"

Thanksgiving can be stressful for people who have lost a loved one since the holiday may evoke feelings of sorrow, anger, and loss. When we are gathered around the Thanksgiving table, it's evident we have lost someone and their role in our family, be it a mother, father, spouse, or child.

So what can we do to help the people we love who are still grieving the loss of their loved one, no matter how long it has been? First

of all, be gentle with those that are grieving. Everyone grieves differently, and being there for them is one of the best things you can do. Consider acknowledging the loss of the loved one when saying grace before the meal, reciting a poem in remembrance, cooking a favorite dish, lighting a candle, or placing a picture of the deceased person on the table. Ask family members to share their favorite stories or memories of their loved one. You'll be surprised; sometimes, those stories lead to laughter and joy.

If having the traditional Thanksgiving dinner is just too much for you to bear, do something different this year. Go out to a restaurant or a friend's house. Consider volunteering at a shelter, soup kitchen, hospital, nursing home, assisted living center, or animal shelter. Not sure you want to do that? Donate to one of those places in your loved one's name.

We do not need to choose between grief and gratitude during Thanksgiving. We can grieve the loss of our loved ones and be thankful for

God and the blessings in our lives. Grief is a journey for each person, with no time limit or set course. There will be good days and bad days. There will be times when you think you are getting better, then all of a sudden (maybe even a year or two after losing your loved one), you backslide and feel sad or teary again. We need to be patient with ourselves.

On Sunday, Nov. 19, 2023, from 1 to 3 PM in the Social Hall, Therese of Lisieux will host a grief workshop called "Hope for the Holidays" facilitated by Heidi Boccomino, LMSW and St. Therese of Lisieux Health Ministry Member. We hope you will join us for a healing experience.
