Today, we begin a new liturgical year using the cycle B Sunday readings. Most of the Gospel passages will be taken from the Gospel of St. Mark, the shortest of the Gospels. Mark could be likened to Sgt. Friday from the old TV show "Dragnet," who was fond of saying, "Just the facts, ma'am, just the facts." Mark relates events from the life of Jesus without much embellishment, whereas the other

Gospel writers like to offer details and anecdotal references.

Today's passage is no different: the focus is on the word watch. We are told to be vigilant and watch. Since we do not know the time or day of the Lord's coming, we always need to be on guard, but more importantly, do the tasks assigned to us.

In other words, we need to be about the Lord's business, living out the Gospel in our daily lives. During this Advent, ask yourself, "How am I living the Gospel in concrete ways?" There are many opportunities to further your spiritual growth this season. See the bulletin and website for the various activities at St. Therese and in our Family of Parishes. Have a great week.

What's it gonna take to get me to turn?

We are in that time again where we set back our clocks an hour, turn on the heat in our houses, make sure our cars are holding up (along with the air in the tires), get our snow blowers and shovels ready, and put away our summer clothes to bring out our sweaters, hats, and gloves. These are all steps we must take to prepare for another winter season in Michigan! We do these things because we know what is coming. but what would happen if we didn't do these things? We would be caught off-guard and left out in the cold-literally!

Our scripture readings on this first week of Advent warn us to stay alert and turn back to our Lord so we are prepared. We do not know when Jesus will return, but we know he will come to us when we least expect it. A few weeks ago, we heard about the parable of the ten virgins, half of whom neglected to fill their lamps with oil in preparation. This parable represents our lives regarding our obedience to the Lord's teachings. When we become disobedient and turn away from him, we lose vigilance and become unprepared to receive Jesus when he comes again. This is the same warning he gives in the Gospel this week, where the man traveling abroad leaves his servants in charge of his home and orders a watch at the gate. We are

the servants of his Church, which he left in our care. We are entrusted with continuing his work and have been given the gifts of the Holy Spirit to do so.

Advent lets us refocus where we are in our readiness and turn back to the Lord so we can be prepared for the season of his return. How can we do this? Eucharistic Adoration is a beautiful time to sit before the Lord and be with him. We move away from the many distractions in our lives and focus on what he tells us in our hearts. We feel the movements of the Spirit within us. We can use our gifts to volunteer at our parishes and serve the community. This service could be with the Knights of Columbus, Altar Society, Ushers, Altar Servers, Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, Lectors, or other ministries that support our community. If we have not been to confession in a while, we can turn back to pray for forgiveness. If we haven't attended Mass very often, we can resolve to attend weekend Mass. The critical thing to remember is the Lord wants us to return to him with open arms. No matter where we are in our faith lives, Jesus always meets us where we are **now**. So, we have an opportunity in the weeks of Advent to ask ourselves: What will it take for me to return to Jesus so I am prepared?


BREAKFAST WITH ST. NICK


the entire family and you don't have to be a registered parishioner. There is a \$5 registration fee per family and you can register by going to our website with the QR code.


The Meaning of Advent

Advent is upon us, and as parishioners of the Catholic faith, we have all heard the term many times in the weeks before Christmas. Let's refresh and review some of the roots of the word Advent. It comes from a Latin word, adventis, which translates to "a coming"—the faithful preparation for the coming of the Christ child. Advent has been a part of the liturgical calendar since the 6th century. We commemorate the four Sundays before Christmas with the Advent wreath and the four candles. The 1st, 2nd, and 4th Sundays are represented with purple candles signifying Penance, Preparation/

Anticipation, and Royalty. The 3rd

Sunday, known as *Gaudete Sunday*, is represented by a rose/pink candle, signifying Joy and Rejoicing. *Gaudete* comes from a Latin word meaning "rejoice." Overall, the wreath's circular shape refers to Eternity—no beginning or end to Christ's everlasting Love and Faithfulness.

I'm taking a quick break from my focus on the Eucharist in order to encourage some creative prayer practices for the season of Advent. Why? Well, many of us fans fall into a rut regarding prayer life. I know, because it has happened to me. I have heard from others that their prayer life is stale, but they just don't know how to break out of that pattern they made for themselves years, and years ago! Here are some ideas:

- Decorate your home with an Advent Wreath, and use one of the many advent wreath prayers that you can find online, like this one from Dynamic Catholic: "Dear Jesus, as we light the candle(s) on this Advent wreath, may the light of your presence bring joy to our hearts. Bless our family and our friends, and be with all those who are in need this holiday season. Amen."
- Set time aside to pray with a seasonal prayer booklet, like the one available from the diocese of Saginaw, through the "Amen" or "Hallow" app, or countless other places.
- Pray for the recipient of each of the gifts you have bought as you wrap them. Even if you put the gift in a bag or envelope, a quick prayer is better than none at all.
- Say a prayer together at any seasonal gathering. It can be as easy as the perfunctory, "name

- one thing you are grateful for," or as deep as giving those in the group time to reflect on the following prompts that they will, then, pray aloud with the group: What prayer do you have for someone you missed seeing in the past several months? Is there someone you know of that is isolated from gathering with others for one reason, or another? What are your deepest concerns that weigh heavy on you today?
- Pray by writing a letter to God.
 Be creative! Prayer journaling is
 another option. Just taking the
 time to write down the things
 you want to talk to God about
 while in prayer is a great practice
 for many people.
- Pray for someone, then write them a note telling them that you did! I know many people who have cherished knowing that others care enough to pray, AND to send them a note.
- Commit to praying over all of your meals - all through Advent, and even Christmas Season. It could be the traditional "Grace," or something like this one from the folks at Lifelong Faith: "As we prepare for the coming of your Son, O God, We give you thanks for your light which shines brightly among our family and friends. We give you thanks for this food and drink, which nourishes us to be your light and

- strengthens us to share your gifts with the hungry and all who look for your justice and mercy. Amen"
- Say a prayer while you decorate your home, cook, bake, or involve yourself with any kind of preparation for a celebration. The prayers can be for those who will be gathering with you, or those who cannot.
- Draw, color, or create your prayer using whatever creative means you'd like. I spent many years creating prayer shawls, where praying while knitting or crocheting was part of the process. Do what works for you.

As you know, there are many ways to pray. Hopefully one of these ideas serve as a spark to lift your Advent prayer to a bright and love-filled place, bringing you peace and joy.




