Merry Christmas!

Yes, we are still in the Christmas season, and today, we celebrate Holy Family Sunday. Today's feast is a reminder that every family is called to be holy in imitation of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. If we are in a familial situation, we are called to be holy.

As we enter the New Year, may each of us strive to put Paul's words into practice—not just in our families but in our schools and workplaces, churches and social gathering spaces, and sporting arenas and shopping centers. unique composition and challenges are called to this same holiness. In embracing our imperfections and striving for love and unity, we honor the true spirit of a Christian family.







2023 Health Ministry Wrap-Up

During the Christmas season, I always reflect on the year and the blessings God has bestowed upon us.

Although Christmas is usually a time for fun-filled celebrations, it is important to remember that it also might be a time of sadness and loneliness. Hosting Grief Support groups at St. Therese over the last few years has taught me that there are no "time limits" for those who have suffered a loss, even though others may think sufficient time has passed. We must respect grief as a journey for each person, and the holidays may be difficult for them.

It is important to keep our parishioners, community, and world in our prayers and support those suffering physically or mentally. The St. Therese of Lisieux Health Ministry is here to help you. Please reach out to a Health Ministry member or the Parish Office if you need help or support.

St. Therese of Lisieux Health Ministry members have been busy with our "usual" activities, but we have added exciting new programs! As we do at the end of the year, I would like to share some of the Health Ministry's highlights from 2023:

- Our Medical Lending Closet served over 200 parishioners, providing briefs and durable medical equipment like wheelchairs, shower chairs, commodes, and protein supplements at no cost to our community.
- The Health Ministry provided 20

programs totaling 36 education hours throughout the year. Over 642 people attended these programs featuring new topics like Advance Directives, Hospice/Palliative Care, Driver Safety, Dental Care, Gift of Life, Crime Prevention and Fraud Victimization, Elder Law, Medicare and Medicare Supplements, Alzheimer's Disease and Dementia, and Pre-Planning Funerals.

- We provided 3 CPR and AED courses.
- We hosted two flu vaccine events (including a drivethrough), with 64 people attending.
- We hosted informational/ educational tables for parishioners after Masses.
- The Grief Ministry, facilitated by Marilyn Kylmala, sent sympathy and Christmas cards to people who had lost a loved one and hosted a Memorial Mass attended by 74 families.
- Heidi Boccomino, Health Ministry member and social worker, facilitated our "Hope for the Holidays" workshop.
- We hosted three 9-week Grief Support groups for parishioners and the community; Donna Hagg, Paula Breitschuh, and Sr. Mary Andrew helped facilitate these groups.
- Sue Verellen and Donna Ludwig facilitated two widow/widower social groups.
- Sue Verellen and other Health Ministry members provided over 240 hours of respite care,

visits, phone calls, and texts to parishioners.

- We hosted five blood drives this year and collected 110 units of blood from these events.
- Meals from the Heart, led by Mickey Wilson, served meals to parishioners who were ill or who had surgery.
- Health Ministry members, in collaboration with the administrative staff, reviewed and revised the St. Therese of Lisieux Parish Emergency Preparedness Plan (PRES).
- Health Ministry members wrote educational articles for the church bulletin each week.

This list does not include all the countless hours and activities the St. Therese of Lisieux Health Ministry participated in. None of these efforts would be possible without the help of our 49 members who selflessly donate their talents, time, and energy. Not everyone in the Health Ministry is a healthcare worker, but each person contributes in their own way to make our ministry successful. **We are looking for additional members!** If you are interested in joining, please contact Marilyn Cito.

I feel blessed to work with our ministry members, Monsignor Kasza, and the St. Therese of Lisieux administration, staff, ministries, volunteers, and parishioners. It is a **privilege** to be one of **your** St. Therese of Lisieux parish nurses.

Consecration to the Holy Family

Sunday, Dec. 31st, is the feast day of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. On this day, at all the Masses, the Knights of Columbus will distribute "Family Fully Alive" books and prayer cards with a prayer for consecration to the Holy Family.

The "Family Fully Alive" book helps parents strengthen their family by providing monthly themes, prayers, reflections, meditations, scripture readings, and family projects. They will help make your home, or "domestic church," a place of faith, hope, and charity, where each member will grow with grace toward full potential in God.

To help families live out the joy of Christ, K of C Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William Lori composed a prayer through which families can come together to consecrate themselves under the protection of the Holy Family. In this prayer on the back of the card, we ask for the intercession of the perfect son, Jesus, Mary the perfect Mother, and Joseph, the model for every father. We offer our family to Christ and ask Him to help us imitate the Holy Family so we can all enter Heaven as a family, and we ask Mary and Joseph to pray for us. To help your family grow in holiness, say this prayer together on the Feast of the Holy Family or on your family's "birthday"– your wedding anniversary.

Please ensure you get one of these booklets and prayer cards from the Knights in the Gathering Space and use them to transform your family into a "domestic church." Start with the January section on "prayer," which helps put first things first by cultivating a relationship with God together through prayer.

Copies will also be available in the kiosk in the Gathering Space if you did not attend one of these Masses.
