During this year of the Eucharist, the feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (also known as Corpus Christi) receives an added significance. Some studies have shown that many Catholics do not believe in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. They think that sacred elements are merely

symbols of Jesus rather than his body, blood, soul, and divinity.

As Catholics, we acknowledge, believe, and celebrate that at Mass, during the invocation of the Holy Spirit by the priest (known as the epiclesis) and the recitation of the words of institution, ordinary

bread and wine are consecrated to become Jesus Christ. Yes, the consecrated elements still look, feel, and taste like bread and wine, but their essence-their *reality*-has been transformed (transubstantiated) into the body, blood, soul, and divinity of Christ himself. We then consume Jesus Christ, who

What does "real presence" mean to me?

As Deacon Rick and I were traveling to Mackinac Island for the Knights of Columbus State Convention, I remembered I hadn't yet written this Connecting Point article. Looking for inspiration on what to write about, the only thing that came to me that evening was that the Real Presence of Jesus means "everything" to me. But really, what does that mean?

The following day, Deacon and I had the opportunity to go to St. Anne Church and serve Mass. Afterward, we, along with a dozen other priests and about 200 Knights, prayed before the Blessed Sacrament and carried Jesus in procession through the streets to the Grand Hotel, where the convention would be held. The effect that Jesus' Real Presence had on those we passed, both in the Blessed Sacrament and through the witness of over 200

people singing and praying in his honor, was miraculous. Every horse-drawn carriage stopped in reverence. People on the streets cleared a path for Jesus. Some made the sign of the cross, others fell to their knees, but all stopped their conversations to turn and gaze upon this spectacle of Living Faith. What an incredible experience to see how the Real Presence, honored in faith, can affect the world around us.

Both Deacon Rick and I had the honor of carrying Jesus in the procession, and we shared the same moving experience. The way the sunlight shined on Jesus' Real Presence in the Blessed Sacrament caused us to see our faces reflected in the Holy Eucharist. Seeing myself in Jesus almost brought me to tears. In becoming bread for me, he not only enters me through communion



but also draws me into his very self to experience the depth of his peace, love, and joy. In that experience, I realized that being one with Jesus, living "Through him and with him and in him," delivers very palpable peace, love, and joy. Coming only from him, that is the ultimate meaning of "Real Presence." And for me, that is everything!



physically becomes a transformative part of us.

How this transubstantiation occurs is a mystery. In fact, the early Church theologians just said, "It happens."
Later on, people wanted to know the mechanics of the process. The simple explanation is as above:
The substance (essence or reality) changes, but the accident (outward appearance) remains. As Catholics, we believe this is a matter of faith, not science. We believe because of what Jesus said in chapter six of John's Gospel. We believe because of our ancestors' tradition from the past 2000 years.

In your prayer this week, ask the

Lord to strengthen and deepen your belief in the Eucharist. Ask him to transform you and configure you to be more like Christ as you partake in the Eucharistic mystery.

To help us celebrate Mass more prayerfully, we need volunteers. Please consider joining us as a server, lector, extraordinary minister of Holy Communion, usher, or sacristan. 
Jesus' Summer Bucket List



June is Men's Health Month

The purpose of Men's Health Month is to raise awareness of preventable health problems and encourage the early detection and treatment of disease among men and boys. This month is dedicated to education and activities about male health and wellness, including physical health, mental health, and social connection. In June, people should take the opportunity to encourage men and boys to seek regular medical advice and early treatment for disease and injury.

On average, men die five years younger than women and at higher rates from nine of the top 10 causes of death. According to the Centers for Disease Control (CDC), the leading causes of death for men in the U.S. are heart disease, cancer, and accidental injuries. Men are also less likely than women to be insured. Men are twice as likely to have heart attacks than women, and strokes also occur more often in men.

While prostate cancer is the most commonly identified cancer in men and the second leading cause of cancer-related death, lung cancer is the leading cause of cancer-related death in men. Colorectal cancer is also higher in men than women. Men are more susceptible to developing Type 2 diabetes than women because obesity is a significant risk

factor for diabetes, and men tend to have more visceral (abdominal) fat. Since men are more apt to suppress their emotions, they are more prone to depression and suicidal thoughts. Men are less likely to seek help for their depression and may cope with depression in other ways, such as drinking.

Father's Day is nearing, but helping dads (and all men!) is something we should do year-round. Here are a number of things we can do all year:

- Encourage him to get a physical. Most of the factors that contribute to men's shorter, less healthy lives are preventable, and that prevention starts with seeing a healthcare provider on a regular basis. Adult men in the United States visit primary care providers at lower rates than adult women. Establishing baselines and monitoring change for factors such as blood pressure, cholesterol, weight, and PSA (a screening test for prostate cancer risk) will enable the provider to catch potentially dangerous conditions early when they're still treatable.
- Encourage him to get physical.
 Physical activity has extensive health benefits, but many people find it challenging to get motivated on their own. Rather

than simply telling your dad to exercise (and hoping he will), do it with him! Encourage him to join a recreation league in your community, sign up for group or personal training sessions, or make a routine out of regular walks. Walking with a spouse, family member, neighbor, or even a pet makes it much more enjoyable.

- reason men disregard their health is that they're too busy taking care of everyone else.

 What they don't realize, however, is that if they die early, they'll be hurting the very people they've worked so hard to protect. So, remind him that you and your family members love him and need him to be alive and healthy for as long as possible.
- Spread the word! Share this information with your loved ones, friends, co-workers, and others.

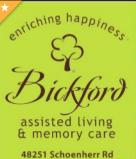
