

MUSINGS + MESSAGES

The opening line of today's first reading is important: "God did not make death, nor does he rejoice in the destruction of the living." Death and sickness are consequences of original sin. However, God's plan was for Adam and Eve to live in the Garden of Eden without experiencing sickness or death.

Although illness, disease, and death are consequences of sin, they are not the result of sin. In the ancient world, people often attributed serious illness to a person's moral life. For example, if a person had cancer, it was because they lived a sinful life. In some cases, sinful behavior can lead to sickness or

death. Overindulging in liquor may end in cirrhosis of the liver. The sin (gluttony) caused the illness. But not always. Sometimes, an innocent person becomes ill (a child with leukemia, for example).

In his ministry, Jesus came to show us that he was master over sin,

What in your life do you still wish Jesus would heal?

What in your life do you still wish Jesus would heal? This question strikes at the center of our human nature, touching on the vulnerabilities and yearnings we often carry silently within ourselves. Each of us bears wounds-some visible, others hidden beneath smiles and everyday routines. These wounds may be the results of grief, anxiety, depression, guilt, financial struggles, or unresolved conflicts. When we think about this question, we are invited to reflect deeply on our own lives. We are reminded that Jesus, the healer of souls, stands ready to embrace us in our brokenness. He intimately understands our pain because he endured suffering on the cross.

However, Jesus' healing goes beyond physical ailments; it encompasses the healing of our hearts, minds, and spirits. It involves the restoration of relationships, the lifting of burdens of guilt, and the peace that is beyond understanding. Jairus and the ill woman, in the Gospel story,

approached Jesus in faith. Their example shows us how we should bring our wounds before Jesus. Sometimes, our doubts, grudges, unforgiveness, and mistrust get in the way of his healing. Jesus meets us not with judgment or indifference but with compassion and love. He invites us to surrender our pain to him, trusting that he can bring about healing in a way we didn't expect. Furthermore, healing is not always instantaneous; it requires patience, faith, and openness to God's timing. Sometimes, healing comes through the support of others: a friend's listening ear, a counselor's advice, a clergy member's guidance, or a community's prayers. This is why living as a community of faith is so important. We help and support each other!

As we reflect on what we wish Jesus would heal in our lives, let us also consider how we can be instruments of his healing for others. Perhaps there is someone we know who is silently carrying a burden that we



could lighten through kindness, understanding, or a simple gesture of compassion. May we take comfort in knowing that Jesus walks with us in our pain, desiring to bring healing into our lives. Let us approach him with patience and open hearts so that any obstacle to faith may be removed and our prayers of intercession may fall at his feet, allowing his healing grace to touch our hearts.


Pope Francis' Comments on Our Environment

DISCIPLESHIP FORMATION

GROW and MISSION Program Updates

"GROW" and "MISSION" are the names that we use for our children's formation classes for children in grades 1-9. These are the programs that teach children about Jesus, the Church, prayer, and the sacraments.

Registration for the 2024-2025 season of Discipleship Formation is open and available online. Please visit our website, under "parish life / discipleship formation" in order to find the form.

The process for registering students for grades 1-9 is easy, and can be completed fully online including payment. Once you access the form, you'll be able to choose the grade level, and if you are seeking sacrament preparation for any of your children. Please note that our Sunday programs, called Children's Church and Little Lambs don't require pre-registration.

If you have any questions, or if you need to make payment arrangements, please contact the Discipleship Formation office. No student will be turned away due to an inability to pay.

Adult Formation

St. Therese Parish has a rich history of adult formation opportunities, and we expect the tradition to continue. As we finish up our sessions on discovering the roots of the Eucharist in scripture, and "The Case for Jesus" a deep dive into the historicity of Jesus' life, death, and resurrection, we are planning for the future. Low Back Pain

Why does it seem like so many people have back pain? Low back pain is one of the most common types of pain reported by patients and causes more disability than any other condition. It is the most common cause of job-related disability and a leading contributor to missed days and visits to physicians.

In 2018, 28% of men and 31.6% of women aged 18 years or greater reported they had lower back pain within the last three months. The percentage of women with back pain increased as age increased. Among men, the percentage increased with age through 74 years, then decreased. About 80% of adults have low-back pain at some point in their lives.

Conditions commonly linked to back pain include:

Muscle or ligament strain. Occurs with repeated heavy lifting or a sudden awkward movement. If you are overweight, or in poor physical condition, constant strain on your back can cause painful muscle spasms.

Bulging or ruptured disks. Occurs when the disks in your back, which acts as cushions between the bones (vertebrae) in your spine, bulge or rupture and press on a nerve.

Arthritis. Osteoarthritis can affect

the lower back and sometimes leads to a narrowing of the space around the spinal cord, called spinal stenosis.

Skeletal irregularities. This is a condition where the spine curves to the side, called scoliosis, and can lead to back pain in middle age.

Osteoporosis. Vertebrae in the spine can develop compression fractures if you have osteoporosis and bones become porous and brittle.

Anyone can develop back pain, even children and teens. Risk factors include age (more common as you age), lack of exercise (unused muscles in back or abdomen), excess weight (extra weight puts extra stress on your back), certain diseases (arthritis, cancer), improper lifting (using your back instead of your legs), certain psychological conditions (depression and anxiety) and smoking (reduces blood flow to the lower spine).

Back pain may feel like a dull, constant ache or a sudden, sharp pain. Pain can result from an accident, fall, lifting something heavy, changes that happen in the spine as you age, or a medical condition. Although most patients do not go to the doctor for acute low back pain, sometimes treatment is needed, if severe. Treatment depends on the cause and symptoms of pain. Treatment may include overthe-counter and/or prescription

medications, superficial heat, massage, acupuncture, or spinal manipulation.

Preventing back pain is key and can helped by using proper body mechanics, using good posture, not standing in one position for a long time, exercising, increasing your muscle strength and flexibility, maintaining a healthy weight, and not smoking. One way to help with prevention is by joining our Stretch and Strength classes at St. Therese of Lisieux on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays from 9:30 AM-10:30 AM in the Social Hall.

St. Therese will also be hosting an Back Pain educational lecture on July 11, 2024 from 12:30 PM-1:30 PM. presented by Sara Geisman, from Plymouth Physical Therapy. 


