

# MUSINGS + MESSAGES

One of the first sayings I learned at the seminary was from Sr. Mary Finn, HVM, who said, "Keep your eyes fixed on Jesus." Today's responsorial psalm (123) reminds us to do just that. When we keep our eyes fixed on the Lord, we can endure all things, especially those mentioned by St. Paul in the second reading.

Although scholars have made many

speculations, we do not know which "thorn in the flesh" Paul was referencing in this passage. However, what is important is the line, "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness." Despite our failings (and even our sinfulness), we need to remember that God is in charge. He calls the shots. God takes our weaknesses and transforms them for his purposes.

Keeping our eyes fixed on the Lord does not mean that we will not sin; rather, it means that when we sin, we can pick ourselves up and move forward again. Our goal is to become perfect in the Lord. The first step in that journey is to keep our eyes focused on the goalkeeper.

#### How can obstinance limit God's grace from entering my heart?

"Hard of face and obstinate of heart are they to whom I am sending you. But you shall say to them: Thus says the Lord GOD!" (Ez 2:4).

Relationships are hard. Family members disappoint us, neighbors, co-workers, and even friends anger us, and our spouses frustrate us. Amidst our anger and hurt, we can become obstinate—a word of Latin origin meaning "stubborn."

Because humans are creatures of habit, it is only natural for us to do things the way we have always done them, including reacting when others hurt us: "I can't believe she did that to me!" "I am so done with him!" "I am never speaking to them again!" Perhaps "thinking the same thing over and over and expecting different results" could describe the hopelessness of these situations. When we resolve to remain obstinate in our reactions, we are pulled even deeper into the pit of our own tendencies, thereby closing our hearts to God's grace.

On paper, most Christians would

agree that we should not allow our hurt and anger to guide the ways we live with one another, yet how do we break free from our deep, negative emotions? Consider these words from Matthew 5:22-24: "But I say to you, whoever is angry with his brother will be liable to judgment, and whoever says to his brother, 'Raga,' will be answerable to the Sanhedrin, and whoever says, 'You fool,' will be liable to fiery Gehenna. Therefore, if you bring your gift to the altar, and there recall that your brother has anything against you, leave your gift there at the altar, go first and be reconciled with your brother, and then come and offer your gift."

We are called to enter this process of opening our hearts—in other words, "Letting go and letting God." We must make a conscious spiritual decision to release "the beams in our own eyes" (Mt 7:5)—including assumptions, judgments, grudges, resentments, and obstinance—to make room in our hearts for the grace of God to flow freely toward forgiveness. Amidst the hurtful,



seemingly selfish acts of others, it is most often our own selfish lack of trust in the Lord that causes rifts in those relationships. Giving everything up to God is really the way to rise above our disappointments. We must have faith that God's grace is infinitely more powerful than any storm we face.

May we open our hearts to God's grace so that his mercy will guide us to forgiveness, understanding, and love.



# **Eucharistic Miracles**

Evangelization Committee

There are 107 Eucharistic Miracles approved for veneration by the Catholic Church. Over the next few weeks, we will present the story of a few of them.

In the 8th century, a priest in Lanciano, Italy, doubted the Real Presence of Jesus during the consecration. He was startled to see the host change into Flesh and the wine into Blood. In the following centuries, many scientific studies have been done on them, and most

amazingly of all, they are still visibly preserved to this day. The studies done in 1970 (and repeated in 1982) confirmed that:

- The Flesh is real human flesh, and the Blood is real human blood.
- The Flesh is composed of cardiac muscle tissue, and there is no evidence that any preservative agents are present.
- The Blood is type AB, which matches the blood on the



Shroud of Turin.

The proteins and minerals in the Blood are similar to those of fresh blood.

Pope Francis reminds us that "The primary mission of the church is to evangelize."

### Be Alert to Skin Cancer!

Skin cancers often start as changes to the skin, including growths that change over time. That's why it is important to be familiar with any growths or moles you have, know the early warning signs of skin cancer, and get checked out by a physician. It is estimated that 40-50% of fair-skinned people 65 years or older develop at least one skin cancer during their lifetime. If found and treated early, skin cancer can be cured.

Check your entire body for moles or suspicious spots at least monthly. Start at your head, including your scalp, and progress to your feet. Check the backs of your knees, between fingers and toes, the soles of your feet, and your groin. Checking for suspicious moles should be done on people of all ages, and if you have a lot of moles, your doctor may recommend getting a yearly full-body check.

An easy method to check skin growths/moles on your body is the ABCDEs of melanoma. Get examined by a dermatologist if you have a mole or freckle that looks different from the others or has any of the characteristics listed below:

A is for asymmetry. Asymmetry means that one half of a mole does not "match" the other; normal moles are symmetrical. An excellent way to evaluate this is to draw an imaginary line through the middle of the mole and compare the two halves. If they do not look the same, consult a dermatologist.

**B** is for *border*. If a mole's edges are ragged, blurred, or irregular, have it checked out. Melanoma lesions often have uneven borders.

**C** is for *color*. A mole that is not the same color throughout or that has shades of tan, brown, black, blue, white, or red is suspicious. Normal moles are usually one color, and if one has gotten lighter or darker in color, talk to a dermatologist.

**D** is for *diameter*. A mole is suspicious if the diameter is larger than a pencil eraser. If you have one that size or larger, talk to your doctor.

**E** is for *evolving*. If you see a mole that is evolving, shrinking, getting larger, changing in color, or beginning to itch or bleed, get it checked. Melanomas grow in height and size rapidly.

If you notice a mole or spot with any of the ABCDEs of melanoma, or if it is itchy, tender, red, oozing, scaly, or not healing, consult with your doctor. Likely, part of it will be removed and biopsied. If the mole is cancerous, the entire mole and surrounding tissue will be removed.


Malignant melanoma, when found in late stages, is difficult to treat, so it is essential to find it early. Basal cell carcinoma and squamous cell carcinoma are other types of skin cancer that are highly curable when found and treated early. People who have had skin cancer are at risk of getting it again and should have annual exams.

Sun exposure is the biggest cause of skin cancer, but heredity, environmental hazards, and radiation treatment may also play a part. While anyone can develop skin cancer, the risk is higher for individuals with fair skin and light-colored eyes, a large number of irregularly shaped moles, a family history of skin cancer, a history of excessive sun exposure or sunburns, or those who live in areas with high altitudes or year-round sunshine.

If you are at risk, limit your exposure to the sun's ultraviolet rays between 10 AM and 4 PM, use sunscreen with an SPF of 30 or higher, wear a hat and sunglasses, and cover up your body. Young infants should be kept out of direct sun. Begin using sunscreen on children at six months of age, and then allow only moderate sun exposure. Teach your children sun protection early since sun damage occurs with unprotected exposure and accumulates throughout a lifetime.


