As we continue our walk through the sixth chapter of John's Gospel, those who hear Jesus' message are somewhat baffled. They know him as the son of Joseph and Mary, but his preaching takes them by surprise. When Jesus calls himself "the bread of life," it challenges his listeners. In effect, Jesus is offering them eternal life.

The Eucharist gives us the opportunity to become one with the Lord. However, that relationship must also be reflected in our daily lives. Paul's letter to the Ephesians reminds us that we need to be "imitators of God" by putting aside those actions that are un-Godlike. In short, one cannot consume the Eucharist and, at the same time, harbor bitterness,

fury, and malice toward others. In short, we need to become what we believe and what we consume.

This week, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Plan to attend Mass on Thursday, August 15 at 8:30 AM or 7 PM.

#### Where are there bitterness and anger in my life that need to be released?

Bitterness and anger are like heavy chains that bind our hearts, preventing us from experiencing full joy and peace. They are often born from deep wounds, unmet expectations, or perceived injustices that have taken root over time. To ask, "Where are there bitterness and anger in my life that need to be released?" is to embark on a courageous journey of self-discovery and healing. In this Sunday's second reading, we hear from St. Paul how "all bitterness, fury, anger, shouting, and reviling must be removed from you, along with all malice." Let's take a closer look at how to remove these toxic traits.

Begin by looking inward with honesty and compassion. Reflect on past hurts and unresolved conflicts. Is there lingering resentment toward a friend or family member who wronged you? Do certain memories still evoke a sense of injustice or betrayal? Identifying these sources of bitterness is the first step toward release.

Consider the impacts of holding onto these emotions. Bitterness and anger affect your emotional well-being, **as well as** your spiritual growth, physical health, and relationships. They can create barriers to love and trust, isolating you from those who care about you. Recognize that releasing these burdens is not about condoning the wrongs done to you but, instead, freeing yourself from their hold.

The next line in the second reading gives us a solution to bitterness and anger: "And be kind to one another, compassionate, forgiving one another as God has forgiven you in Christ." Forgiveness is a powerful antidote to bitterness. It is a conscious decision to let go of resentment and to extend grace, even when it feels undeserved. Forgiving others (and, sometimes, ourselves) opens the door to healing. It allows us to move forward, unencumbered by the weight of past hurts.

Prayer and meditation can be invaluable tools in this process. They offer moments of stillness where you can seek divine guidance and strength. Ask for the courage to face your pain, the wisdom to understand it, and the grace to let it go.

Release the bitterness and anger that have held you captive. Embrace



forgiveness, let your heart be light again, and surround yourself with a supportive community that encourages and uplifts you. In this newfound freedom, you will find peace, joy, and a deeper connection to the divine and those around you.

The readings this weekend bring us closer to God through the words and actions of Elijah, St. Paul, and Jesus. All three could rightly have been filled with bitterness and anger, yet they looked past the heavy chains that could have bound their hearts, showing us a pathway to joy and peace.



### St. Vincent de Paul at St. Therese of Lisieux

In our previous article, we said that we grow in holiness by serving our Neighbors-in-Need (NIN). Let us explain: we work in pairs when assisting our NIN, especially when we go on home visits, which are at the heart of what we do. We come ready to listen without judgment, understand with empathy, and uncover ways we can help beyond addressing the immediate needs. We offer to pray with them before and after our visit, even asking if they want to lead the prayer. It's in these home visits where friendship, faith, and service collide—where we help our neighbors see (and ultimately realize) the possibility of a better tomorrow.

At our monthly SVdP meetings, we discuss how we helped our NIN.
Other SVdP members can suggest ways to improve, approach the NIN from a different perspective, and point out the good things we did so that others can adopt those practices.

## Inspiring Stories that Encourage Us to Bring God to Others in Our Lives



This week, let's look at the story of St. Kateri Tekakwitha, a Native American who lived over 400 years ago. Born to a Mohawk chief and an Algonquin woman in 1656, in what is now New York state, St. Kateri was orphaned at the age of four. In 1676, she was drawn to Catholicism by missionaries and baptized. Because she devoted her life to Jesus and lived a Christian lifestyle, those in her village did not accept her and forced her to flee. St. Kateri spent the rest of her short life near Montreal devoted to prayer, doing penance, and caring for the sick and aged.

When she died in 1680, her last words were, "Jesus, I love you." As the first Native North American to be declared a saint (by Pope Benedict XVI in 2012), she is venerated for her devotion to Christ and her commitment to charity and chastity. She is also recognized as the patron saint of the environment and ecology.

St. Kateri is the result of the successful evangelization efforts of Jesuit priests in our region.

She serves as an example of how ordinary people, through serving others, can inspire each of us to



strive for sainthood. This reminds us that, even today, none of us are too young or uneducated to bring Christ into our world by following our faith and helping others.


Pope Francis reminds us that "The primary mission of the church is to evangelize."



### Cataracts

The lens of our eyes is normally clear and allows light to pass to the back of the eye so we can see. Cataracts cause a gradual yellowing and clouding of the lens of our eyes, vision gets hazy, and it may seem like we are looking through a "smudged" window. Cataracts can occur in one or both eyes and are not painful. You may not even realize your vision is not as good as it was in the past, or just attribute it to "getting older." Cataracts can occur at any age but are most commonly found in people ages 55 and older.

Cloudy vision may only affect a small part of the lens in the beginning, but as the cataract continues to grow, vision gets blurrier. Sometimes, the clear lens turns yellow or brownish and changes the colors you see. Some common symptoms of cataracts are:

- It is hard to see at night
- Sensitivity to light
- Sometimes, there are "halos" around light sources
- Double vision
- Colors do not look as bright as they used to be

If you start to notice some of these

changes, or any other changes to your vision, it is important to make an appointment for an eye exam. Even if you do not have any of these changes, it is important to have an annual dilated eye exam.

When you go for your appointment, your doctor will give you a thorough eye exam and perform several different tests. Based on these results, he will recommend the best course of action. Sometimes a prescription for new eyeglasses may improve vision affected by a cataract in the early stages. But over time, glasses may not be enough to restore good vision and surgery may be needed.

If you are beginning to experience some of these vision problems, try using brighter lights for daily tasks, and anti-glare sunglasses when you are outside. Magnifying lens might help when doing certain tasks like reading or intricate projects. Wearing sunglasses is highly recommended to protect your eyes, whenever it is sunny outside.

Cataracts are not totally preventable but maintaining healthy lifestyle

habits can reduce the risk of developing them and other diseases. Vitamins that help keep eyes healthy are Vitamin C, Vitamin E and Zinc. Lutein and Zeaxanthin are two ocular nutrients that are also beneficial to your eyes and can be found in green leafy vegetables. Your eye doctor may also recommend "special" eye vitamins. Avoiding smoking and drinking alcohol can also reduce the risk of developing cataracts. Early detection and treatment of cataracts is critical to preserving your eyesight.


