During the Protestant Reformation of the sixteenth century, a favorite phrase was *sola fidei*, which meant “faith alone.” This was the reformers’ way of saying that faith itself would save you. As Catholic Christians, though, we believe that Jesus Christ saved us, and our response to that salvation is to live our lives by demonstrating our faith through good works.

In other words, it is not good enough to say, “I have faith,” if I do not actively live out that faith by doing works of charity or mercy. St. James reminds us that faith without works is dead. On the other hand, someone could do good works without having any kind of faith tradition. Who, then, is the better person? The one who professes a faith but doesn’t live it? Or the one

who lives a good life but has no specific faith background?

However, if one claims to be Catholic or Christian, that person should demonstrate their faith by good works. Moreover, if we truly believe our faith, we will live that faith even to the point of death.

► What do I do with the discomfort of following Jesus?

It is getting close to election time. As such, in the near future, I bet many of us are going to have uncomfortable conversations with friends or family because their thoughts and choices don't align with ours. As we know, those conversations can even devolve into verbal attacks. The uneasy feelings that result can be overwhelming and make us want to insulate ourselves from the outside world. Discomfort can also come from times when we read scripture or hear a homily at Mass and are challenged by the message because we are falling short in how we live our lives. This reality of discomfort coming from both outside sources and inside ourselves is a reality when we live as disciples of Jesus! Fortunately, we can look to this week's readings for inspiration as to how we can manage the discomfort of following him.

Our first reading provides some guidance regarding confrontation with the attitudes of the world around us. To "set my face like flint," knowing that "the Lord GOD is my help," points to the fact that our silence is often the best answer. Think about it; it's rare to engage in a verbal altercation with someone and have them come away from that encounter totally won over to our point of view! As mentioned

in the Gospel, taking up our cross involves losing our lives for Jesus' sake. In practice, that "losing" is often a willingness to set our egos aside in order to let Jesus, or Jesus' message, take center stage. While not providing us with an opportunity to prove how smart or "good" we are, a simple "that's not what I believe," followed by silence, repeated if necessary, states our position without the extra words that the other person is probably going to shut out anyway. Furthermore, the beauty of de-escalating a disagreement in this way is that the resulting silence provides a space for the Spirit to enter, especially if we ask in prayer. Knowing that God is with us as we uphold justice, love, and peace is quite the consolation for a bruised ego. Moreover, hopefully, this technique also provides us with the time to feel understanding and compassion for those who persecute us—and to pray for them, as well.

As mentioned before, in addition to external influences, we have times when we find ourselves confronted by our internal discomfort as we struggle to live as disciples of Jesus. The second reading reminds us that, sometimes, we separate faith from life, especially when actually behaving like a follower of Jesus proves to be uncomfortable. For

example, I think most of us have taken on a "what's in it for me" kind of attitude when making a decision, like voting, barely considering if others would be negatively affected. Furthermore, we may practice our faith and go to church every Sunday but fail to help the poor person on the side of the street, turning our heads the other way when we see them. Sure, each of these scenarios represents complex situations, yet in the second reading, we hear, "Faith of itself, if it does not have works, is dead." Essentially, the scripture is saying that thoughts and prayers, while good and purposeful, aren't putting food in people's bellies. We have a choice; when confronted with our failing to actually act upon our faith, the discomfort that results can be one that we embrace—or one that we push aside. Again, from the Gospel, we hear, "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me." Taking up our crosses involves not shying away from these situations but instead using them to propel us toward "doable" actions that provide us the opportunity to live our faith through "works."

To conclude, whether our source of discomfort is an external influence that rubs us the wrong way or the internal disquiet of struggling to put

DISCIPLESHIP FORMATION

Our programs are up and running!

Whether it is a Sunday option that allows children to learn about Jesus, or to hear the Mass readings in a way that they can understand, or our programs that provide formation for older learners, we are excited to see what a new year will bring! If you haven't noticed before, St. Therese Parish staff provide formation that extends beyond the classroom. With events like the "Prayer Walk" or "Pray-zing" we integrate creative methods that encourage parent involvement in their children's formation.

One thing that is new this year: We will, now, be including opportunities for parent formation, for all registered families, through an email three times per month. Through these emails we hope to provide brief articles or videos that will provide a survey of the faith that can build up a parent's understanding so they can better help with the formation of their children. Starting with bible basics, and moving on to the sacraments, and beyond, we'll also be answering questions and providing parents the opportunity to dig deeper if they want to. The flexibility of accessing these emails anytime they want is really important for today's busy schedules.

Please keep our program participants in your prayers. From the "littles," and the school-aged, to their parents, we're blessed to have the opportunity to support and nurture the faith journeys of so many wonderful people.

Adult Formation Opportunities

We have two studies of the Book of Revelation that are just starting, and the year-long study focused on the prophets as part of a journey through the entire bible with "The Catholic Biblical School of Michigan," all available to anyone who cares to join us. Registration is needed for these classes, and there is a fee, but you still have time, if you register now! We also have a Women of Faith Discussion Group that meets in the morning, twice per month, and a book club that discusses one book per month as well. works" connection and having a hand in building God's kingdom here on earth.

► “Stop the Bleed” Educational Program

St. Therese of Lisieux will be hosting a “STOP THE BLEED” program presentation by Brian Werner, the Deputy Marshall of Shelby Township Fire Department, on September 25 from 6:30-7:30 PM. You may ask, “what is this program about and why are we having this lecture at St. Therese?”

Sadly, as we all know, shooting situations are all too common in our country nowadays. With the continuing violence in our nation’s schools, churches, and other places where people should feel safe, the American College of Surgeons’ (ACS) developed an educational program called “Stop the Bleed” to empower the general public to make a difference in a life-threatening emergency.

Since a person who is bleeding can die from blood loss within five minutes, it is important to quickly stop the blood loss. Those nearest to someone with life threatening injuries are best positioned to provide first aid care until a professional can arrive. YOU may be able to save a life by taking some simple actions right after the trauma. This education will help you anywhere you go where a life threatening bleeding injury might occur. This could happen at work, church, school, entertainment or political event, or even in your own home.

After attending this session, you will be able to recognize life-threatening bleeding in someone who is injured, effectively assist that person, and save a life. Studies have shown help provided by an immediate responder can make the difference between

life and death, even before medical professionals arrive.

During the “Stop the Bleed” presentation, you will learn to:

- Determine if an area is safe for you to proceed toward a victim to provide assistance.
- Identify any nearby tools to assist you such as a publicly placed bleeding control kit (like the one at St. Therese) or everyday items that can be used to control bleeding.
- Use your hands to apply direct pressure at the site of the wound to stop bleeding.
- Pack a deep wound with cloth or gauze to control bleeding.
- Correctly apply a tourniquet to an injured limb to stop bleeding.
- Keep the victim calm until help arrives.

For more than a decade, the American College of Surgeons has been a leader in bringing this training program to communities around the United States and the world. The program now operates in 138 countries, including Ukraine, where it has been used to bring these life-saving techniques to citizens impacted by the war.

As the program has grown to train more than 2.6 million individuals in bleeding control techniques worldwide, trauma surgeon David S. Shapiro, MD, MHCM, FCCM, FACS, is one of many surgeons who has witnessed firsthand how the program can empower everyone to learn life-saving skills. Training sites have included firehouses, community centers, hospitals, and schools. Even school children have been taught.

When teaching courses in the community and speaking about the program, Dr. Shapiro often refers to STOP THE BLEED® as “the CPR of bleeding.”

None of us want to think bad things can happen, but unfortunately they do. The methods taught during this program can be used during situations such as severe weather conditions, active shooter incidents, accidents, and trauma situations. But, emergencies can occur ANYWHERE! Although the information in this presentation might sound scary and you don’t want to think about situations like this, you could save someone’s life if you are educated!

St. Therese of Lisieux Church has a Trauma Kit which is located in the Emergency Medical Supplies alcove in the Gathering Space near our First Aid Back packs and Automatic External Defibrillator (AED). Should there ever be an emergency in the church area where people are injured and bleeding, the kit can easily be removed from the wall and brought to the injured person(s).

The Health Ministry is hosting this educational offering in the evening, in an effort to reach as many people as possible to participate in this important event.
