In today's second reading, St. James challenges us to reflect on where our conflicts and issues come from. Ultimately, he says, they come from our passions—in other words, our wants, needs, and desires. Our passions and disordered affections cause us to seek after things that

do not give us inner peace.

When we seek after the wrong things, they cause conflict within us. Think about the person who desires a particular object and does everything to obtain it. Once they get it, that object becomes

iust another thing in their closet or house. Madison Avenue has built many a fortune by preying on people's passions. Beanie Babies, Xboxes, Corvettes, shoes, purses-and the list goes onwere purchased by people whose passions were fueled by a clever ad

## Don't let your passion take you too far.

As one of the world's greatest White Castle lovers, I can vouch for the truth of their current slogan: "The Crave is a Powerful Thing!" Even though I know they aren't good for my health, my passion for sliders is powerful; I can't help it. I also have a passion for other unhealthy foods, such as apple fritters, buttered popcorn, and Sanders' Bumpy Cake. I am told that, in order to keep these passions from taking me too far, I need to eat more kale and spinach... and veggie burgers (oh my)!

In the second reading at Mass this weekend, St. James tells us that wars and conflicts come from the "passions" (sometimes translated as "cravings") for things of this world. We covet, pray for, and pay for the wrong things, in addition to envying what others have: the latest toy, designer clothes, luxury cars and homes, a comfortable retirement plan, etc. In today's Gospel, the

disciples are envious and crave power. Jesus cautions them to be humble, like children.

We need to work hard, lest our passions take us too far away from God and his wisdom. We must crave the "things from above," which, as St. James writes, are "first pure, then peaceable, gentle, willing to yield, full of mercy and good fruits, without a trace of hypocrisy or partiality." All of these lead to peace rather than war and conflict. It is God's will that we live in peace. Who doesn't want to do that?

Each of us must find ways to do this. It may be helpful to pray for the needs of others rather than selfishly asking for our own, get involved in peace-making and social justice ministries, find our identity in being close to God—not our possessions, handle disputes with mercy and love, and look up to people who have

godly wisdom rather than the rich and famous.

The Crave—for the things from above—should be a Powerful Thing!

campaign.

As James correctly notes, the cycle repeats itself time and again. So how do we "stop the insanity?" Start by focusing on the first part of today's

second reading: cultivate peace and wisdom. In our prayer, ask the Lord to give us the wisdom to seek after those things that quell our passions and give us **true** peace and satisfaction. Instead of seeking to be happy, pray for contentment. Instead of trying to fill our closets with things, fill our hearts with gentleness, compassion, mercy, and sincerity. Instead of asking, think about *giving*.




2 Evangelization Committee

# DISCIPLESHIP FORMATION

#### Spread the word!

Classes have already begun. Formation for children in grades 1-9 is available on Monday or Tuesday evenings, and through our home study and parish participation hybrid, "Living Faith." We have sent emails and put articles in the bulletin, but busy families are often hard to notify. If you know of any school-aged children who haven't been registered for formation classes yet this year, please reach out to them and let them know that registration is fully online and easy. All parents need to do is to visit the parish website and click on "Discipleship Formation" which can be easily found under "Parish Life" on our main page.

If families are hesitant to register due to financial concerns, please reassure them. No child is denied formation due to an inability to pay. Just reach out to us.

#### Something new for parents

Whether it is something about bible basics, the sacraments, or the positive relationship between science and religion... parents of all students who are registered in our formation programs will be sent a SHORT email on, or around the 1st, 11th, and 22nd of each month, September 11 - May 11. That email will contain just a few sentences and

a link to a brief video, or article. The whole thing should take less than 15 minutes to view or read. It is our hope that this information can help parents in their own understanding of the faith so they can build skills for leading their families in parish participation. We also hope that it can serve as a forum to have their faith questions answered as well. Please pray for all those involved.

## How Grief Can Affect Your Health

Have you or someone you know experienced the loss of a spouse, parent, or child recently? Did you lose someone a while back and are still struggling with that loss? Despite the perception that grief should be a brief period of sadness after a loss, it rarely is. It isn't as simple as grieving at a funeral, or taking some days off at work. It's more than just an emotional response to losing someone, it's a process that affects us physically, psychologically, behaviorally, spiritually, socially, and culturally. How each of us reacts and mourns is unique, but there are some common physical manifestations that we all experience with loss.

Sleep problems is a common symptom of grief. Grief can keep you from getting the regular sleep your mind and body needs. You might have problems falling asleep, waking up in the middle of the night, or sleeping too much. If this is something that you are experiencing, try winding down slowly before bed, taking a bath or shower, reading a book, breathing exercises, praying, meditating, and going to bed and waking up at the same time each day.

The immune system is also affected

by grief. Grief takes a toll on the body's ability to fight illness and infection, especially if it goes on for a long time. Inflammation occurs when your immune system responds to something it sees as a threat and makes tissues in your body swell. It can play a role in heart disease. arthritis, diabetes, asthma, and possibly cancer. Studies show the more severe the grief, the more serious the inflammation. To fight this, eat a healthy diet, get rest, and exercise. If you feel you are having a hard time coping with your loss, talk about options with your healthcare provider.

Grieving also causes increased amounts of cortisol (stress hormone) to be released into your bloodstream, especially during the first six months. High levels of cortisol over a long period of time, can raise your chances of heart disease or high blood pressure.

Experiencing a loss can make you feel like you have lost control over your life. You might be worried about your financial future or being alone. You might need to do things you never had to do before which can be scary, overwhelming, or even make you angry! Some worry after a loss is normal, but if it lasts more than a few

months, or gets in the way of work or home, it may be time to talk to a professional.

The emotional toll of grief can cause people to feel fatigued and drained of energy. Sometimes it's hard to get moving, but staying connected to family and friends will give you a sense of connection and motivate you to do some things you might not do if alone.

If you feel uncomfortable talking with family or friends about your loss, consider joining the grief support group at St. Therese of Lisieux. The Health Ministry at St. Therese offers three nine-week sessions every year. The Grief Support Group is made up of people who have attended in the past and is always excited to welcome new members! During these sessions, people share stories and feelings with others in similar situations. The Health Ministry facilitators also share Information and strategies to help people cope with their loss. The next session starts on September 24, Tuesday, from 1:00 PM - 2:30 PM in Room #10 and runs through November 18. # ► The Servite Mission Appeal for Zululand is the Weekend of September 28 & 29

The Order Friar Servants of Mary (Servites) was started by seven cloth merchants outside Florence, Italy in 1233. Known as the Seven Holy Founders, canonized in 1888, their Feast Day is February 17. The most well-known Servite Saint is St. Peregrine Laziosi, O.S.M., patron of those with cancer and life-threatening illness. Their work began in the Vicariate of Ingwavuma, Zululand, Natal, South Africa, in 1948. Our Servite Mission Appeals support the daily ministry to the Zulu Catholics

in the Vicariate, the evangelization of the non-Catholic, and the formation of Servite seminarians.

Thank you to your pastor and the Archdiocese of Detroit for allowing us to be part of the 2024 Missionary Cooperative Plan. The Servites had staffed the now closed parishes of St. John Berchmans and St. Juliana Falconieri on Detroit's eastside. Fr. Paul Gins, O.S.M. from Chicago, will be the homilist that weekend.




