We have arrived at the midway point of the Advent season. Today is traditionally called Gaudete Sunday because the readings and the antiphons use the word "joy" or "rejoice" in them. We are reminded to rejoice in the Lord because the Lord is near, and salvation is upon us.

The responsorial psalm, written by Jack Noble White as a song entitled "First Song of Isaiah," is one of my favorites. Whenever I hear that rendition of Isaiah 12, it gives me great joy and hope because the music is stately and enthusiastic at the same time. I encourage you to look it up on the internet.

Too often, we fail to rejoice. We are unable to find joy in life. We become bogged down in mundane activities and the problems of everyday life, and we cannot see the forest for the trees. When this happens, we are prevented from loving others because we can't even love ourselves.

How can I love all more joyfully?

In this Sunday's readings, those who heard John's preaching of the Good News were filled with "expectation." He told them to exercise the same kind of radical hospitality, service, and giving that the Advent Conspiracy is all about. But today's readings also include the exhortation to "rejoice" and "shout for joy" because of God's presence in our midst—and for the second coming of our savior. How, in heaven's name, can we be joyful when living as disciples of Jesus may seem like more than we can handle? The answer is to take each day one step at a time. Let me share a quick story.

Years ago, I had a member of my staff who suffered the death of her mother-in-law. I felt that it was important to go to the funeral home and stay for the "service," yet it was a particularly busy time of year, so I wasn't planning on going to the luncheon that followed. I had already made my decision when, after the service, our pastor asked if I was planning to attend. What stands out, in my memory, was the somewhat incredulous tone in my voice when I answered, "No! I just don't have the

time!" (Surely, he knew how busy I was!) The other things that stood out to me were the volume of my voice and how close my staff member and her husband were standing as I spoke. I left the funeral home, and as time passed, I felt worse and worse. I'm sure they must have heard me. Hadn't I (essentially) said that my busy life took precedence over being with them in a time of suffering? By God's grace, I came to see that "presence" can mean the world to people and that there is great value in just "showing up." I don't need to have the right words or solve all the world's problems. I can simply choose to love by "being there" for someone. When more is needed. I can choose the next, best step—one simple, doable step at a time. There is great joy in that knowledge.

On this Gaudete Sunday, when all of the readings point to God calling us to be joyful, may we all choose love amidst last-minute Christmas shopping clashes and holiday gettogethers with family (and others who push our buttons in this postelection climate). May our joy come from knowing that presence is often



enough and that the next, doable step will present itself, bringing joy from any corresponding response. May we also know that relationships are more important than issues and that we can simply choose "presence" over arguing any point. As I see it, that interaction might sound something like this: "Uncle Bob, today is Christmas. I just want to think about how blessed we are to be celebrating God's gift of Jesus' birth with our family today. That other stuff can wait. Have I told you lately how much I love you?"

Christmas Novena

Solemn Christmas Novena—Dec.

16-24: A tradition at St. Therese of Lisieux to pray for all the intentions of the members of our family of origin, family of parishes, and family of God.

Introduction to the Novena: We will be praying with the O Antiphons and two symbols, the "Rose of Judah" as an introduction and "Mary" as a conclusion to complete the nine days.

Explanation: Advent, the season of waiting and longing for the Lord, is moving into the final week. The Church presents us with seven O Antiphons. They are beautiful, poetic expressions of humankind's yearning for her Savior. Each "O" Antiphon, as it expresses our longing, announces a

title of the Messiah from the Hebrew Scriptures: O Wisdom, O Lord of Might, O Root of Jesse, O Key of David, O Dayspring, O Desire of Nations, O Emmanuel.

The O Antiphons build to a pleading highpoint imploring the Savior to "COME." Incredible, as it may sound, the initials of the "O" Antiphons (Emmanuel, O Emmanuel; Rex, O Desire of the Nations; Oriens, O Dayspring; Clavis, O Key of David; Radix, O Root of Jesse; Adonai, O Lord of Might; Sapientia, O Wisdom) taken in reverse order of the original Latin text form an acronym, ERO CRAS, translated and interpreted as the responding cry of the Savior to His people as: "Tomorrow, I shall be there."

Our Novena will begin on Monday, Dec. 16, at 2 PM, and each subsequent day will be prayed during the Mass.

The Novena will conclude on Tuesday, Dec. 24, at 10 AM - Morning Prayer in Church.

Sheets with all prayers will be available at all morning Masses.

Making Room for Hope

Happy holiday moments include bright lights, happy music, and families having fun. We see these in countless ads and in all the stores, but these joyous occasions can also bring about very sad times if you have lost someone through death, illness, or other separations. It can be the most difficult time of the year to cope with.

Hope is the fuel we need to get through these tough times—easier said than done, right? The Catholic calendar centers this time around Advent—finding light during the darkest nights as we wait and prepare for the Christ child. What are some things we can do to bring hope to our grieving situations?

There is science behind hope. It is defined as "The mechanism that facilitates coping with loss, illness, and other stresses." Here are a few suggestions that might help bring hope to your grief:

- Acknowledge that your hope feels lost
- Know that hope can be restored
- Remember the happy times with your loved one
- Think about the lessons learned while they were with you
- Listen to the music they loved
- Remember the support they gave you
- Create a time and space for grief by spending 5-10 minutes each day journaling your thoughts



- Invite friends and family over to decorate the tree, make your loved one's favorite cookies, etc.
- Create new traditions
- Spend time helping someone in need
- Seek counseling if you can't do it alone

Hope is not denying how hard grief is. It is the fuel we need to keep going. It is what Jesus wants us to do: find the light in the darkness.

Advent Wreath Prayers

This week, consider adding the Advent Wreath tradition to your meal prayer at dinner each night. If that's too much, maybe just on Sunday. Whatever works for you is a step toward deeper meaning. Here's how. While you light the first three candles in the order of—purple, purple, then pink, pray using these words:

On this Gaudete Sunday, as we light the pink candle of joy, help me (us) remember that love often looks like "presence." When I'm (we're) tempted to get caught up in last-minute holiday stresses or tense conversations, let me (us) choose relationships over arguments, connection over conflict. Let me (us) choose love, one step at a time. Let me (us) choose it in the way I (we) speak, the way I (we) listen, and the way I (we) show up for others. It's in choosing kindness over frustration and unity over division.

This Advent, let me (us) choose to love all more joyfully. Let me (us) be present for those around me (us), even when it feels inconvenient. And let me (us) remember that in choosing love, I (we) make room for God's joy to fill my (our) heart(s) and our world. (Follow with meal prayer, if fitting.) –Amen!

Children's Discipleship Formation

This is the time of year when we hold slightly fewer "regular" class sessions, allowing more time for family events and special gatherings here at the church. The foundational principle behind these gatherings, is to provide opportunities for children to see their parents modeling faith. The other reason for these intergenerational gatherings is that it is very beneficial for families to hear, see, and participate in learning activities together. Those shared experiences provide the opportunity for future conversation, and/or interest in learning more, together, as a family. We know, if "religion" gets stuck in a classroom, it becomes nothing more than an academic subject that has nothing to do with daily life. These types of events build the bridges between brain, hands and heart, so families can live their faith more fully.


