

# **Connecting Point**

When St. Isidore parishioner, Kurt Klein, created the sculpture that graces the baptismal pool in our church, he wanted it to be unique. He achieved this goal by including Jesus, Mother Mary, and John the Baptist in a single work of art. Interestingly, these are the only three people whose nativities into

this world are celebrated with a feast day: Jesus on Dec. 25, Mary on Sept. 8, and John the Baptist on Jun. 24. (All other saints' feasts are celebrated on the days of their death, marking their birth into eternal life.) This particularity alone highlights the importance of John the Baptist.

John's greatness was in preparing the way for Jesus and pointing out Christ's coming. In Kurt's sculpture, John points to Jesus and holds a banner inscribed with the word *Ecce*—"This" is the Lamb of God. In today's Gospel, on the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, John humbly acknowledges Jesus as

someone greater than himself. It was never about drawing people to himself—but to the *Lord*. So, how can we follow John's example and point others toward Christ?

In his letter to Titus (today's second reading), Paul offers guidance on revealing Jesus: "Reject godless ways and worldly desires and live temperately, justly, and devoutly." In other words, we make Christ the center of our lives, allowing Jesus to influence all that we do. We live the Gospel values. We are generous and loving without condition. Just as John the Baptist gives Jesus the credit in today's Gospel, we humbly recognize Christ for all the good He

accomplishes through us. It is not about us or what we do; it is about what *Christ* does through us.

Similarly, our Family of Parishes is tasked **not** with drawing people to our parishes (by touting our greatness!) but with drawing others to *Jesus*. We do this in many ways, including inspiring worship, outreach ministries, faith formation, concerts, and working for a more just world in all our parishes throughout the year.

As we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord, let us respond to our own baptismal calls by pointing others toward Christ.



Reynolds. Tickets will sell out, so get yours online or in the parish office: \$80 per couple or \$400 for a table of ten (all seats must be purchased at the same time).


### **Projection of Readings**

### Do You Have a Heart?

Words from Pope Francis' recent encyclical...

"The most decisive question we can ask is. 'Do I have a heart?'"

The pope continued to write how the human being is more than an instrument, a material body, or a carrier of intelligence and reason.

The human person also embodies spiritual, emotional, creative, and affective dimensions that are often undervalued, neglected,

or squelched in today's world. The heart integrates all these dimensions, which are so often fragmented.

The most precious treasures that animate and dwell in the human heart are often the simple and poignant moments in life: "How we first used a fork to seal the edges of pies as we helped our mothers and grandmothers to make at home;" "a smile we elicited by telling a joke;" "the worms we collected in a shoebox;" and "a wish we made

when plucking a daisy."

"All these little things, ordinary in themselves yet extraordinary for us, can never be captured by algorithms" or artificial intelligence, he wrote. In fact, "poetry and love are necessary to save our humanity."

# DISCIPLESHIP FORMATION

#### **Adult Bible Study Starting Soon!**

It isn't too late to register for our first class! If you haven't registered yet, you can still drop in. We'll make arrangements for your book right away.

Starting Jan. 7 and 9, we will be offering a tensession study of "Lectio: Salvation New Life in Christ," with video lectures featuring Dr.

Michael Barber. Sessions will be offered with a choice of Tuesday mornings, from 9:30 to 11

AM, and/or Thursday evenings, from 6:30 to 8

PM. Participants can choose whichever session best fits their schedule, even toggling between mornings and evenings, as needed. In class, we'll discuss the fact that Catholics confess that Jesus came down from heaven "for us men and for our salvation" at every Mass, yet we don't always have a clear understanding of what "salvation" really means. In this video-guided study, scripture scholar and theologian Michael Patrick Barber

provides a thorough, deeply Catholic, and deeply biblical answer. Based on the best-selling book, *Salvation: What Every Catholic Should Know*, this program is inspiring, engaging, and is expected to be a great discussion starter! #### **Home Blessing**

One tradition in the Catholic Church is to bless chalk at the Epiphany Masses and then use the blessed chalk to bless one's home in the New Year. Even if you don't have chalk from church, you can still bless your house.

The home blessing can be done as follows: Using chalk, mark the current year and the initials of the Magi above the outside doorways of your home. Place a cross between each of the letters like this: 20+C+M+B+XX (XX = last two digits of current year). Then, pray the following prayer:

May all who come to our home this year rejoice to find Christ living among us, and may we seek and serve Jesus by finding him in everyone we meet. We pray this prayer in the name of Jesus, who is Lord of all people, forever and ever. Amen.

The legendary names of the three Maji are Casper, Melchior, and Balthasar. The initials C+M+B stand for three Latin words: Christus Mansionem Benedicat, which means "May Christ bless this dwelling." If possible, the markings over the doors should be left all year.

### How to Boost Immunity in Cold Weather

As daylight hours shorten, the weather gets colder, and we will spend more time indoors, the chances of catching a cold or seasonal virus increase. In an effort to "boost" your immunity system to avoid getting sick, I thought I would share a few strategies.

- Getting a good night's sleep is vital to your overall health, as well as an important step in boosting your immune system. While you are sleeping, your body produces proteins that direct your immune cells to fight inflammation. Research has shown if you don't get enough sleep, you are more prone to getting sick after exposure to a virus, and you will stay sick longer! Although eight hours of sleep is a great goal, some people do not require the eight hours. You probably already know how many hours your body functions well at, so use that as a gauge.
- Make sure you eat well. This
  includes not overeating, and
  eating healthy foods. Eat
  a diet high in vitamins and
  minerals, drink water, and avoid
  processed foods. Cut back on
  caffeine and alcohol. Eat fruits
  and vegetables, nuts, and oats
  to boost your immune system
  and fight inflammation. Eating
  healthy is probably one of the

- best ways to fight infection. Vitamins A, C, E and D may help prevent illness. Consider taking a daily multivitamin.
- Although this is easier said than done, try to reduce stress. Stress affects your immune system by decreasing white blood cells that helps fight off infection. Try and limit the amount of news you watch, listen to, or read. It is important to find ways to relieve your stress. Breathing, praying, meditating, yoga, stretching, mindfulness, walking, and doing other self-care activities will help relieve stress.
- Exercising is another way to boost your immune system.

  Maintaining a good exercise plan during the winter months is more challenging than during the summer. If you exercise outdoors, make sure you are using the correct foot gear, layer clothes appropriately, and use caution when extremely cold. If there is snow and ice, wear boots with grips to avoid falling. Exercising will also help with sleep.
- Reach out to a friend, make a new friend, or get/foster a pet.
   Social connections with others helps keep your immune systems working well. Enjoying time with someone or a pet, releases chemicals in your brain that boosts your mood, lowers your

- blood pressure, and keeps your brain healthy.
- And, staying up to date with annual physical examinations and blood work, screenings, and dental exams, is important. Getting the CDC-recommended vaccines like flu, RSV, COVID, pneumonia, and shingles is important in strengthening your immune system to fight off any viruses you may encounter.

While all of these things sound simple, sometimes doing them requires we make changes to our lifestyle. Eating healthy foods and snacks, getting motivated to exercise when you are not used to or feel like it, and practicing self-care strategies when we are not used to focusing on our ourselves, requires a commitment to take care of bodies. Doing so, is not selfish. Committing to one or two of these changes is a great start! Our mental, physical, and spiritual health needs to be a priority for each of us if we wish be well!


