My family and I have been involved in the life of a Catholic parish for as long as I can remember. I have an aunt who was an Adrian Dominican sister. My Dad was a lector, catechist, extraordinary minister of the Eucharist, and more. My brother and I were members of the choir, and on and on. this reading, you also heard that "the parts of the body that seem to be weaker are all the more necessary" and "God has so constructed the body as to give greater honor to a part that is without it, so that there may be no division in the body...If one part suffers, all the parts suffer with it; if one part is honored, all the parts share its joy" (v 24, 26). God's plan is for all to be valued, cared for, and appreciated, especially those within the body of Christ.

Think about all those who are involved in providing liturgies and programs within our faith communities. Whether paid staff or volunteers, recognize those who provide us with clean bathrooms, functioning heating and cooling systems, attractive bulletins, and clean floors, as well as those who lead us in prayer, teach us about the faith, sing, play instruments, pay the bills, and more! It takes effort

from all of us, working together, to bring about all of the good that we accomplish. Moreover, just as Jesus proclaimed in today's gospel, his mission was/is about bringing "glad tidings" to those on the margins. We, too, as members of his body, are called to bring affirmation and positivity to those around us. Our "good news," like Jesus', is about salvation through Christ, but it is also about building up and affirming each other so we can continue to spread the joy of the gospel.

This week, our challenge is to acknowledge the efforts and talents of others, whether inside or outside the body. By affirming others, we'll be building up God's kingdom here on earth, drawing others to Christ by our example. Try it out! May your kind words be contagious, and may your warm smiles serve as a boost to weary souls.

the world. Things can change, but it begins with us!



Strokes

I'm sure everyone knows someone who has had a stroke. Strokes are the fifth leading cause of death in the U.S., killing more than 130,000 Americans each year. Someone in the U.S. has a stroke approximately every 40 seconds and dies every 4 minutes. About 795,000 people each year have a stroke in the U.S., and it is the leading cause of disability. Strokes cost the nation \$33 billion annually, including the cost of healthcare services and lost productivity.

Symptoms of a stroke include sudden numbness or weakness in the face, arm, or leg (usually affecting one side of the body), confusion, difficulty speaking or understanding, issues with vision in one or both eyes (e.g., blurred or double vision), slurred or garbled speech, loss of muscle control on one side of the face, trouble walking, dizziness, loss of balance or coordination, or severe headache.

A stroke, also known as a brain attack, occurs when a blood vessel that carries oxygen and nutrients to the brain is either blocked or ruptured. *Ischemic strokes* account for 80% of strokes and occur when a clot blocks a vessel. Causes include atrial fibrillation (irregular heartbeat that puts the person at a five-times greater risk of stroke), a hole between the person's heart

chambers that usually closes before adulthood, blood clotting disorders, or a buildup of fats or cholesterol. A hemorrhagic stroke occurs when a weakened blood vessel ruptures. When either of these happens, part of the brain cannot get the blood (or oxygen) it needs, so brain cells die. That's why strokes are medical emergencies, and 911 should be called immediately!

The best treatments for strokes are available only if the stroke is recognized and diagnosed within **three hours** of the first symptoms. Stroke patients may not be eligible for these treatments if they don't arrive at the hospital in time. If you think someone is having a stroke, act **F.A.S.T.** and do the following test:

- F—Face: Ask the person to smile. Does one side of their face droop?
- A—Arms: Ask the person to raise both arms. Does one arm drift downward?
- S—Speech: Ask the person to repeat a simple phrase. Is the speech slurred or strange?
- T—Time: If you see any of these signs, call 911 right away.

It is important to note and communicate to the healthcare provider the time when symptoms first appeared since this information will determine the best treatment. Do not drive to the hospital or let someone else drive. Call 911 for an ambulance so that medical personnel can begin life-saving treatment *on* the way to the emergency room.

Sometimes, people experience a T.I.A. (*transient ischemic attack*) before having a stroke. These are "warning strokes" that can occur before a major stroke when blood flow through a brain artery is briefly blocked or reduced. A person who has a T.I.A. is 9.5 times more likely to have a stroke. T.I.A. symptoms are temporary but similar to those of a stroke. Even though this is not a stroke, a T.I.A. **is** a medical emergency.


