WHAT MOTIVATES ME TO SPREAD GOD'S

On this Third Sunday of Easter, we hear the beautiful conversation between Jesus and Peter. Three times Jesus asks Peter if he loves him, and three times Peter answers, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you." This exchange is a kind of reconciliation for the three times that Peter denied Jesus prior to his crucifixion.

But there's more. In English, we have one word for love. In Greek, the language in which the New Testament was written, there are at least eight words to describe love. The three that are most often used, however, are agape, eros, and philia. Agape could be translated as "to will the good of another," or altruistic love. Eros

refers to sexual passion or intimate love. *Philia*, rendered in English as "friendship" (as in Philadelphia, "the city of brotherly love"), refers to loyalty between friends, family, or community.

In the first two questions to Peter, Jesus uses the word *agape*, and Peter answers with *philia*. The

third time Jesus asks the question, he uses the word *philia* to indicate that he is meeting Peter where he is. Jesus loves us with *agape* love—the highest, most altruistic form of love. But Peter was only capable of offering his loyalty. So, the third time, Jesus adjusts his language and asks

if Peter can love him as a friend.

That was enough for the Lord because God meets us where we are. He calls us to a higher realm but will come down to our level to raise us up. As Christians, we are called to do the same: meet people where they are to bring them closer to God.

Congratulations to those who received First Eucharist last week and to those who are receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation this week. May God continue to bless you on your Christian journey.

What motivates me to spread God's message of love?

The truth is that it's been tough to feel motivated lately. I've found myself pulling back in my ways, especially from social media, because the noise has just gotten too loud. Everyone seems to have an opinion about what it means to be Catholic and where our focus should be, and honestly, some of it has made me feel more frustrated than inspired.

Stepping back has helped me clear my head and remember that my call to follow Jesus isn't about keeping up with someone else's version of Catholicism; it's about staying true to what I believe and how I'm called to live that out. That's going to look different for each of us, and that's okay.


In the Gospel this week, Jesus asks

Peter, "Do you love me?" And after each "Yes," He tells him, "Feed my sheep." It's simple: If we love Him, we keep going. We show up. We take care of others. We share love in the way that's most reflective of who we are.

But that doesn't mean it's easy. This week's first reading reminds us how the early followers of Jesus were mistreated for speaking His name; however, they continued to rejoice. That kind of joy and courage can be hard to relate to, but it's also motivating. They didn't give up. They stayed focused on their mission, even when it came with pushback.

Some people spread love through Adoration or daily rosaries. Others do so through listening, being present, or using their voice in a way that encourages and uplifts. There's no one right way. What matters is that we don't check out—even when it's messy or hard; we find our way of spreading God's love, and we stay grounded in that.

If you've felt discouraged lately, I get it. But maybe this is your reminder that even small, quiet efforts matter. Keep going. Keep loving. And do it in a way that feels real to you.



What is "Fish Tales?"

While reading the church bulletin, you have probably noticed brief articles called "Fish Tales." They have been a part of the bulletin for a number of years and are written by members of the Evangelization Committee. The central theme is Evangelization. Sometimes, they are informational or inspirational, and often, they give us ideas on how we can joyfully pass on our beautiful Catholic faith by evangelizing.

Throughout the next several weeks, we will focus on **Fulton Sheen, a wonderful Catholic evangelizer**. He was one of the first Catholic TV evangelizers, known to 30 million viewers with his program called "Life is Worth Living." His first TV broadcast was on Easter Sunday,

March 24, 1940. Prior to television, he had a weekly radio show. He won an Emmy award for being named the "Most Outstanding Personality" and appeared on the cover of Time Magazine.

He was bold, enthusiastic, innovative, and inspirational—a true evangelizer. In the coming weeks, we will learn more about his background, and many of his inspirational quotes, which are still so meaningful in the world today, will be shared.

Some of Bishop Sheen's thoughts on motherhood will be offered next week.

Atrial Fibrillation

An estimated 12 million people have atrial fibrillation—the most common heart arrhythmia in the U.S. As it increases with age, and women generally live longer than men, more women have atrial fibrillation. Since atrial fibrillation is so common, you likely know someone who has it, but do you know what it is?

Atrial fibrillation is a problem with your heart's rhythm caused by disorganized signals that make your heart's atria (two upper chambers) contract out of sync and so quickly that the walls quiver or fibrillate. Since the atrium guivers, it does not coordinate with the ventricles (the bottom of your heart), and the blood doesn't move well from the atria to the ventricles. Furthermore, the heart may not be able to keep up with the body's needs, causing heart failure. Blood can also pool inside your heart and cause clots, which can cause strokes. That is why if your heart is beating irregularly, you must reach out to your doctor for an examination.

Damage to your heart's electrical system, often resulting from other conditions, can cause atrial fibrillation. The most common causes include age, genes, heart disease, heart attack, sick sinus syndrome, high blood pressure, lung disease, overactive thyroid, obesity, diabetes, sleep apnea, or infections caused by a virus. Sometimes, however, doctors are unable to determine the cause.

Symptoms of atrial fibrillation include irregular heartbeat, palpitations, pain and pressure in your chest, confusion, dizziness, shortness of breath, fatigue, and fluttering or quivering in your chest. Age, the cause, and your heart's ability to pump affect whether symptoms appear and their severity.

Doctors classify atrial fibrillation by how long symptoms last. The classifications include paroxysmal fibrillation (lasting 7 days or less), persistent atrial fibrillation (lasting 7 days or more), or permanent atrial fibrillation.

To diagnose atrial fibrillation, your doctor will do tests to check your heartbeat and the electrical impulses in your heart, including an EKG, echocardiogram, stress test, Holter monitor, diagnostic tests, and blood work.

If you feel your heart beating irregularly and not returning to a normal rhythm, or your symptoms worsen, call your doctor! If you experience chest pain or pressure for more than a few minutes, pain that spreads to your jaw, neck, arms, back, or stomach, nausea, cold sweats, drooping face, arm weakness, or trouble speaking, call 911 right away, since these could be signs of a heart attack or stroke.

Some episodes of atrial fibrillation come and go on their own, but others may need treatment, which your doctor will determine. Treatment may involve medication, lifestyle changes, and procedures, such as cardioversion, ablation, pacemakers, or surgery. Sometimes, treatments are necessary to lower your heart rate and bring your heart rhythm back to normal. Your doctor may also recommend medication to reduce your chance of having a stroke.

You may be able to take steps to help ease symptoms or stop an episode of atrial fibrillation when it starts. Avoid triggers such as too much caffeine, alcohol, stress, and not enough sleep. Keep your heart healthy. Take prescribed medications as directed. Eat a healthy diet low in salt and solid fats and high in fruits, veggies, and whole grains. Follow an active lifestyle. Don't smoke. Practice stress-relieving activities like visualization, meditation, focused breathing, stretching and strengthening exercises, and praying, which all may help slow your heart rate down.

When you have atrial fibrillation, you can lead a normal life and do all of your normal activities, such as working, exercising, playing sports, and traveling, as long as you clear it with your doctor first. Your doctor will determine what's safe and what makes sense for you.


