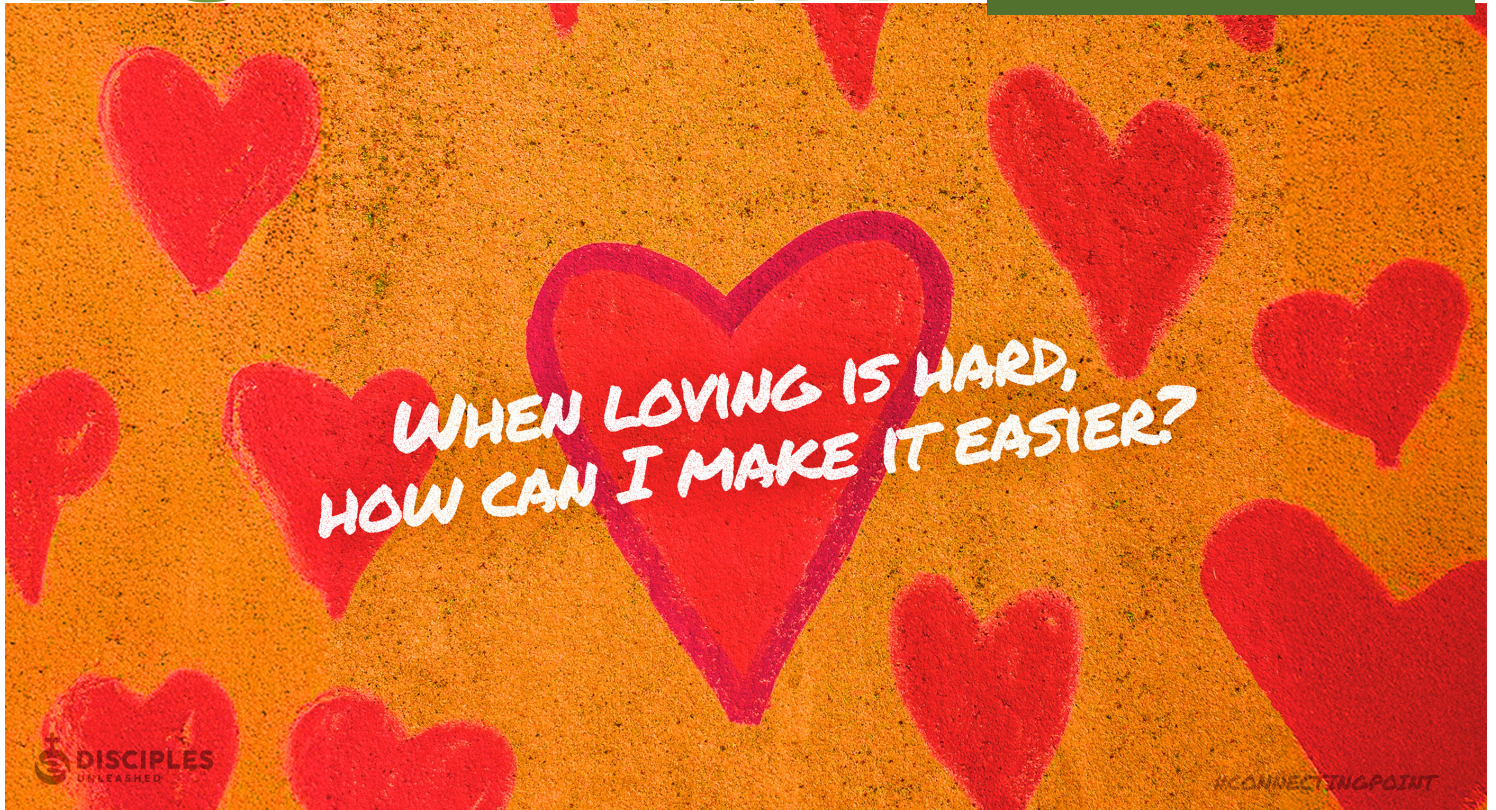

We are now about halfway through the Easter season, and the main message is that of love. The last line of the passage from John's Gospel sums it up: "This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

People often wonder how the

Church grew from a band of 12 apostles into over one billion today. The answer is simple: demonstrable love. If our faith were not true, why would people join the early Christian community? If people did not feel a strong connection to God, as demonstrated by the love shown among the community members,

why would they put themselves at risk of being captured and killed?

The answer is obvious: The Church has something special to offer that goes deeper than any other entity. Her followers not only believe in the message; they live it. Love is not an emotion; love is a decision that

► When loving is hard, how can I make it easier?

This week's Connecting Point theme reminded me of a Pat Benatar song from the 80s, "Love is a Battlefield." While it sounds like any other pop-rock heartbreak song, it actually delivers the message that love can be difficult, so much so that it feels like a battle within us. Jesus knew about this battle all too well in our Gospel reading, which begins with Judas betraying the Lord by leaving him and the disciples. What a heartbreak for Jesus! Yet, he follows with his greatest commandment: to love one another as he loved us.

Even during our personal struggles, real love costs us. It means listening when we are tired, enduring another person's pain while carrying our own, forgiving even when we feel bitter, and choosing mercy over revenge. Oh, the battle that rages in each of us! But we cannot do it alone; only through the grace of our Lord can

we endure. Not conquer—endure. Paul and Barnabas, in our first reading, fought through hardships, persecution, and rejection, yet they kept going. They knew that real love requires endurance to finish the race on our journey to the Kingdom of Heaven.

So, how can we make it easier? We need people to walk with us, encourage us, and pray with us in times of trouble. We need each other through breakups, betrayals, and rejections. We need to lean deeper into God's grace, even when it costs us something. We draw our strength from the living Jesus within us. That is our path through the battlefield. That is what our community is all about. Love is not just a feeling we have; it is our witness to Jesus.

His love fills what is empty in our hearts so that we can pour it out for



others. Jesus does not want us to become discouraged when love fails or becomes difficult; instead, he asks us to become living signs of his love. Our world seems bent on revenge, division, and fear. However, we can stand up in faith and love, powered by our Lord's sacrifice, for a world that desperately needs it. As Pat Benatar sings, "Heartache to heartache, we stand!"

people make each and every day. That message of love propels people to look forward to the new creation. God makes all things new, as the Book of Revelation tells us. Moreover, God gives us the ability to see the newness of life through the eyes of faith and love.

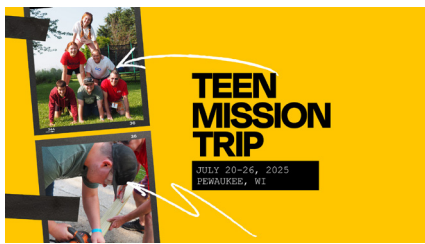

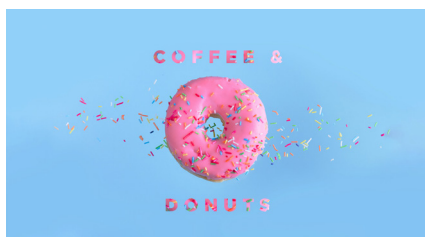

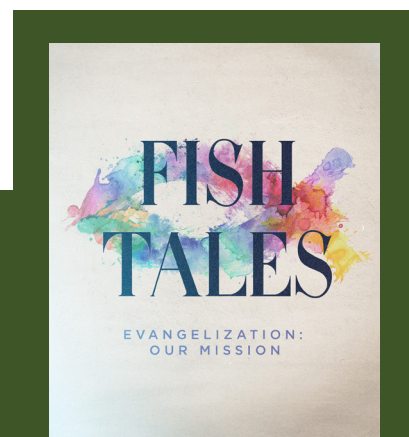

A Few More Interesting Thoughts About Bishop Fulton Sheen

Bishop Fulton Sheen was born in 1895 and baptized as Peter John Sheen. He soon became known as Fulton, which was his mother's maiden name. Interestingly, he was serving Mass with Bishop John Spalding at the age of 8. In preparation for Holy Communion, he dropped the wine cruet, and it shattered into many pieces. Bishop Spalding told him not to be afraid and made two incredible predictions about Fulton: He would study at Leuven in Belgium, and that "one day, you will be just as I am." He was ordained in September 1919 and later pursued advanced studies in Leuven, Belgium.

Here are a few of Bishop Sheen's thoughtful quotes:

- "Patience is power. Patience is not an absence of action; rather, it is 'timing'...it waits on the right time to act, for the right principles, and in the right way."
- Broken things are precious. We eat broken bread because we share in the depth of our Lord and His broken life. Broken flowers give perfume. Broken incense is used in Adoration. A broken ship saved Paul and many of his passengers on their way to Rome. Sometimes, the only way the good Lord can get into people's hearts is to break them.
- Unless there is a Good Friday in your life, there can be no Easter Sunday.

Vaccines

Vaccines (immunizations) protect us from serious diseases and prevent their spread to others. Over the years, immunizations have prevented epidemics of once-common infectious diseases, such as measles and mumps, and nearly eradicated others, including polio and smallpox. Vaccines aren't just for kids; adults need them to protect against diseases that become more common with age. They can also protect you if you missed a dose as a child. Some vaccines only need to be given once, while others require updates or "boosters." Immunizations are a weakened or killed virus, bacteria, or lab-made protein that imitates the virus to prevent infection. Vaccines trigger your body's immune response, causing it to either produce antibodies to that particular disease or induce other processes that enhance immunity. Then, if you're exposed to the disease-causing organism, your immune system is prepared to fight the infection. A vaccine usually prevents the onset of a disease or reduces its severity. Discuss with your doctor, healthcare provider, or pharmacist any vaccines you might need and which ones you should receive annually.

- **Flu vaccine:** Administered as a shot or nasal spray, it is given once a year from September through the end of the flu season, which can extend as late as May. The earlier you get it, the better your protection will be. Those over 65 can get a high-dose injection for better protection.
- **Pneumococcal vaccine:** There are two types available: one for children and adults, and another for older adults and individuals with certain medical conditions.
- **Tetanus, Diphtheria, Pertussis (Tdap) vaccine:** Administered as a single shot, Tdap protects against all three diseases (while the Td variant only protects against tetanus and diphtheria). Tdap is recommended for older children and adults; Td is usually given as a booster dose every 10 years.
- **Hepatitis A vaccine:** Given in

two doses, with the second dose administered six months after the first. It is recommended for children (starting at 12 months) and those at increased risk.

- **Hepatitis B vaccine:** Administered as a series of three to four injections over a 6- to 12-month period, it is recommended for all infants, children, and adults.
- **MMR (Measles, Mumps, Rubella) vaccine:** Administered as a single dose to protect against all three viruses. The CDC recommends two doses of the MMR vaccine, administered four weeks apart.
- **Varicella (Chickenpox) vaccine:** Administered as a series of two shots, it protects against the varicella zoster virus, which causes chickenpox. It can be given at any time in two doses, four to eight weeks apart. It is made with live viruses, so it is not recommended for individuals with a weakened immune system due to a disease or medical treatments (such as steroids or chemotherapy).
- **Meningococcal vaccine:** Protects against four strains of meningococcal disease. Recommended for all preteens and teens, as well as children and adults at increased risk.
- **Shingles (Zoster) vaccine:** Given as a shot in two doses, two to six months apart, for all healthy adults over the age of 50 and any immunocompromised adults over 19 years of age. It can be over 90% effective in preventing shingles, and protection lasts approximately four to five years.
- **HPV vaccine:** Prevents infections caused by several types of HPV, which can lead to various health issues, including some types of cancer. It is recommended for children aged 11 or 12 (and up to age 26) and may also be recommended for those up to 45 years old.
- **COVID-19 vaccine:** This vaccine helps protect from severe illness, hospitalization, and death. Everyone

six months and older should get the COVID-19 vaccine. Since the vaccine's protection decreases over time, it is essential to receive additional boosters as recommended.

Vaccines are very effective at preventing disease, but they don't work all the time. Most of the recommended childhood immunizations are 90-100% effective, according to the CDC. Although a child will not become fully immunized against a disease, those who have received the vaccine are 100% effective in protecting those who have not been fully immunized, thereby lessening everyone's chance of exposure to the disease. Even in cases where a vaccine has not provided 100% immunity to your child, the symptoms will usually be milder than if they had not been immunized at all.

Today, vaccines are considered safe. As with any medication, they can have side effects. In most cases, these are mild. The most common minor reactions to an immunization are soreness or redness around the injection site and/or a low-grade fever. Side effects typically subside within a few days. In rare instances, a high fever or an allergic reaction to vaccines may occur. Ensure your doctor is aware of any allergies.

Although I realize that some people may not agree with vaccinations (which is a personal choice), most medical providers agree that the proven preventive benefits of vaccines far outweigh the minimal risks associated with their side effects.
