

# CONNECTING POINT

Has a new, young coworker ever told you that you don't know how to do the job you've been doing for over twenty years? Or maybe you presented a new insight only for the "powers that be" to insist on doing things the way they've "always been done." I'm sure we can all think of a time when we've offered an

opinion (or even stated a concrete fact) and were dismissed by the listener. Whether in a boardroom or at our own kitchen tables, each of us knows the frustration that comes from this type of human interaction. Rest assured, Jesus knew it, too!

In today's gospel reading (Luke 10:1-

9 or Luke 10:1-12, 17-20), we hear of Jesus sending out 72 disciples. He tells them to go out, minister among the people, cure the sick, and proclaim the Good News of the kingdom of God. He prepares them, though, for the reality that not everyone will welcome their message. He instructs them:

## How do I respond with grace when I feel dismissed?

"When you enter a town and are not welcomed, go out into its streets and say, 'Even the dust of your town that clings to our feet, we wipe off against you." Don't get hung up on the word "against." This response isn't one of hatred or revenge; it is based on the idea of recognizing when the listeners aren't open to our message, moving on, and letting go. In the context of Jesus' mandate. in which His followers are always to choose love over everything else, it makes perfect sense. Jesus wants His disciples to love themselves enough to avoid futile and frustrating pursuits. He also wants them to provide their audience with a clean break, essentially saying, "Okay. We'll leave you alone. Obviously, you aren't ready to hear what we are saying. We take nothing from you, and you owe us nothing." By following Jesus' guidance, they part ways with complete autonomy—an autonomy that respects the individual decisionmaking of all involved.

Jesus' quidance remains relevant for us today. We encounter many situations where agreeing to disagree is the only path forward. Handling these situations with grace means leaning into an expression of courteous goodwill that is built on respecting someone enough to choose to move on and let go. How can we respond with grace when we feel dismissed? Sometimes. that might mean the use of a few. well-chosen words. At other times, remaining silent and eating a bit of "humble pie" might be the best path. Still, maybe it is something else. Whichever way, Paul's oftenrepeated greeting, featured in today's second reading (Galatians 6:14-18), still resonates: "The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with your spirit, brothers and sisters. Amen." Whether asking for God's grace as an unmerited gift of divine assistance in the moment, or as an expression of courteous goodwill, I pray that all of your encounters be overflowing with God's abundant grace.

# Fill a Backpack!



# Tips for Healthy Summer Gatherings

It's July, and the summer seems to be flying by already, which is all the more reason to take advantage of this great weather and plan some summer functions with friends and family. I can't think of anything better than having a picnic or gathering outside to enjoy a wonderful Michigan summer! But eating healthy during the summer is also important. Amidst summer picnics, vacations, barbecues, and scorching temperatures, we sometimes opt for convenience over healthy eating. Regardless, we must eat with "intention." Smart eating and other good health habits (like being physically active) help reduce the risk of chronic diseases like heart disease, diabetes, osteoporosis, and the disabilities that can result from those illnesses.

Since social gatherings with friends and family are an important part of staying well and keeping our minds sharp, plan that picnic and make it a "heart-healthy" event!

Consider the following tips for reinventing the traditional menu without sacrificing taste.

Try some new proteins. Instead
 of traditional hamburgers or
 hot dogs, try black bean vegan
 burgers or turkey dogs, as well
 as grilled portobello mushrooms
 topped with grilled pineapple

- on a whole-wheat bun. Fish (and even turkey) tacos are fun, too, and salmon is always a favorite.
- Let the kids help prepare for the gathering. Kabobs are always a good, low-calorie choice, and they can be grilled or eaten raw! Have the kids cut up fruit and vegetables and put them on skewers. Cutting up vegetables for a salad is also a great activity for kids to participate in.
- Switch up the dips. Replace
   the heavy, high-calorie dip with
   hummus or Greek yogurt-based
   dips. Additionally, consider
   replacing potato chips or Fritos
   with raw vegetables, whole wheat pretzels, Sun Chips, or
   vegetable straws.
- Don't forget the water!

  Eliminate sugary sodas and teas in favor of water, which will keep you hydrated. Plain iced tea with lemon is a good choice. Use a pretty container to hold the water and add fruit or cucumbers. People will love it and find it much more refreshing than soda.
- Think outside of the box for desserts. Instead of having heavy desserts like cake, brownies, and pies, use fresh fruit like watermelon, grapes, or strawberries.
- Enjoy the fresh factor. Support your neighborhood farmers and buy locally grown fruits and

vegetables to incorporate in your summer meals. Attending farmer's markets or visiting the Eastern Market is a fun way to spend a day! Locally grown fresh corn, cherries, strawberries, raspberries, and blueberries are wonderful!

Making wise food choices is important and easier than you think. Additionally, it's equally important that we teach our children healthy eating habits to prevent chronic medical conditions and obesity.




