MUSINGS + MESSAGES

Today, we hear one of the most famous parables uttered by Jesus: the Good Samaritan. It is well-known and often used to illustrate various theological and social truths. Ultimately, however, the story should not even need to be told. Jesus should not have needed to bring it up; **if** only people had

lived by what Moses had told them in Deuteronomy. As he says, the commandment [to love God and love your neighbor as yourself] "is something very near to you, already in your mouths and in your hearts; you have only to carry it out."

Most scripture, theology, and

religious doctrine are common sense. The problem is that sense is not common to most people. What should be obvious is often obscured by legalese, posturing, and excuses about why we can't behave properly. Instead of fixing the issues of the day, we create reasons for why we can't make things better.

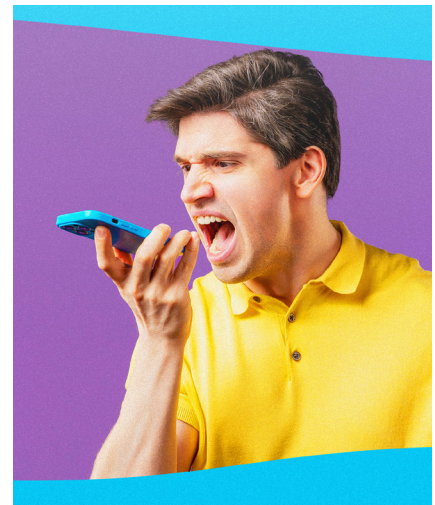
► How does my love for others show up in my speech?

It is said that you only have one chance to make a first impression, but what contributes to people forming one? Your haircut? Your walk? Your attire? While all of these things *are* important, I would suggest that it is our manner of speaking that determines what people think of us. After all, appearances can be deceiving; we may have a bad hair day, or our clothes may be wrinkled from traveling. However, the way we speak to someone reveals a lot about who we are.

Additionally, it is not so much a matter of *what* we say but rather *how* we say it. Does our speech convey compassion or sympathy? Do we exude confidence and eloquence? Or are we off-putting, condescending, or critical in our conversations? How we speak about another person says more about our character than anything else. Do we gossip and

criticize? Do we make comments that condemn others or point out their faults and failings? In short, at a fundamental level, we demonstrate our love of neighbor by the way we speak about them.

And as today's parable tells us, our neighbor is everyone. Whether we know them or not, **everyone** is our brother or sister in Christ. When we speak, do we strive for harmony? Do we try to see the best in others, including those with differing opinions? Our conversations can either bring unity and clarity through a focus on ideas, concepts, solutions, and open collaboration... or they can become occasions for sin through a tendency toward gossip, critique, and simple parroting. In other words, ask yourself: Do I show that I am a child of God by viewing everyone else in the same way?



This week, analyze your speech. Each night, reflect on the conversations you had that day. Were they uplifting and meaningful, or were they critical of others? Did they honor the dignity of the other person, or did the conversation turn into idle chatter? When you spoke, was God's love proclaimed?

► Musings + Messages (cont'd)

Generally, it centers around the idea that "it's someone else's fault" or "I would fix the problem, but so-and-so is preventing me from doing so."

The Samaritan in the parable just

did what needed doing. He did not let his fears or preconceived notions prevent him from doing the right thing. He was truly living God's commands, which were written on his heart. May each of us learn to be

more like the Samaritan and do what is right, true, holy, and just, leaving the details to the Lord.

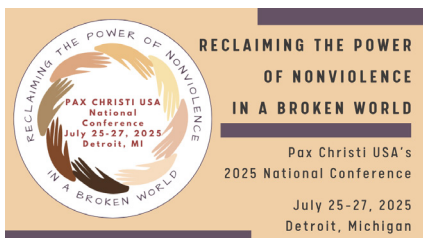

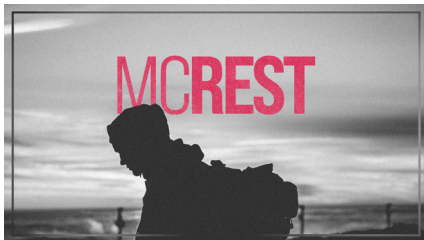

Pope Leo's Time in Peru

We know that Pope Leo looks at his many years in Peru with a very loving heart. In some of his first words as our newly elected Pope, he recalled his work as a missionary in Peru from 1985 to 1998: “And if you will allow me a word, a greeting to all those... in a particular way to my beloved Diocese of Chiclayo, in Peru.”

Known as the “City of Friendship,” Chiclayo is located in northern Peru, about 500 miles from Lima. Pope Francis appointed him as apostolic administrator and then bishop of the Diocese of Chiclayo. He also served as the vice-president of the Peruvian Bishops’ Conference.

In Pope Leo’s words, “I came as a missionary to Chulucanas almost 40 years ago, then 11 years in Trujillo, and eight years in Chiclayo. Thank God

for so many things the Peruvian people have shared with me. We have walked together and shared our faith.”

This is what his colleague, Fr. Guillermo, had to say about him: “We shared many moments of decision-making... and had many opportunities to converse, and I have been able to discover his prudence, his perseverance, his tenacity, and that simplicity that characterizes him, but always with great depth to resolve an issue, any situation, no matter how sensitive. He saw that ‘hope was never lost,’ regardless of the situation.”

May God bless Pope Leo XIV, and may he help to make our world a better place.

You've probably heard time and again that physical activity and mental stimulation are crucial with age, and this fact has been demonstrated through numerous studies! Regular physical activity and exercise help improve the mental and physical health of seniors, as well as their independence.

Studies have shown that maintaining regular physical activity can help prevent many common diseases, such as heart disease and diabetes. Exercise improves our bodies' immune functions, which is especially important in seniors with compromised immune systems. Even walking can be a powerful tool in preventing disease!

Exercise also offers numerous *mental* health benefits. Exercise produces endorphins, which help relieve stress and leave us feeling happy and satisfied. Exercise also helps improve sleep, which is particularly important since seniors may experience insomnia and struggle to stay asleep. Studies also suggest a lower risk of dementia for physically active people.

Since seniors are at a higher risk of falls, it is essential that they maintain strength and flexibility. Exercise

improves balance and coordination, helping to reduce the risk of falls—a devastating and life-altering event for seniors that can impact their independence.

Interacting and socializing with others is also very important in keeping your mind and body healthy and fit. Maintaining strong social ties is important for aging adults to feel a sense of purpose and avoid feelings of loneliness or depression. So, find something you enjoy doing, and it won't seem like a chore! I once heard a speaker say, "Retirement is your chance to do something you are passionate about." That could be volunteering at a hospital, animal shelter, taking up a hobby, or traveling. Also, consider volunteering in one of St. Therese's many ministries! If this sounds like something you'd like to try, please stop by the parish office and ask for the list of ministries and volunteer opportunities. Getting involved is a great way to socialize with people and keep active! Join a walking group or exercise class, such as our Stretch and Strength classes on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays at 9:30 AM.
