HOW CAN I SHIFT MY FOCUS FROM POSSESSIONS TO PURPOSE?

We have a habit of upgrading and accumulating, whether it's more stuff, more savings, or a bigger house. During this pursuit, however, the Word of God questions us boldly: What are you *really* living for? What is your call? Your vocation?

In the Gospel of Luke (12:13-21), Jesus tells the Parable of the Rich Fool, in which a man builds bigger barns to store his wealth, only to find that his life ends that very night. This man was mistaken in letting his possessions define his worth, thereby focusing on material belongings—not purpose.

Furthermore, in Ecclesiastes (2:21), the Teacher recognizes the futility of chasing wealth: "Here is one who has labored with wisdom and knowledge and skill, and yet to another who has not labored over it, he must leave property." This is the reality of a will or testament; one generation's labor becomes

another's inheritance. Still, this transfer, although noble, is not the ultimate goal. Possessions are never an end in themselves, only a means toward something deeper, as we read in the Gospel: "Take care to guard against all greed, for though one may be rich, one's life does not consist of possessions" (Luke 12:15).

The question, "How can I shift my focus from possessions to purpose?" will ring differently depending on your reality. Some of us have more than enough, but many people around the world (and in our own pews) struggle to make ends meet. They are not hoarding; they are surviving or dying. Jesus understood this, saying, "The poor you will always have with you" (Matthew 26:11), exposing the broken systems and hearts that keep people impoverished. Poverty is often not a result of laziness; it is the fruit of collective injustice.

Perhaps this Sunday's message will also challenge us to shift from comfort to compassion. As Paul writes in Colossians (3:1), "Seek what is above." Let our focus rise beyond the latest phone, the perfect vacation, or the safest retirement.

Let it rise to love, mercy, and shared humanity. We are called to be builders of legacy—not consumers of comfort. And that legacy is not found in what we give away, but rather in how we give of ourselves. It's found in real, sacrificial, human generosity and presence in someone's story—not just dropping coins in a jar.

The Psalm this Sunday (90:12) prays, "Teach us to number our days aright, that we may gain a wise heart." Wisdom comes when we remember that our time is short and our possessions can't follow us. Purpose grows when we begin to see the face of Christ in the poor, the overlooked, and the hurting.

Shifting from possessions to purpose means recognizing that what we own does not define us. What we give and how we give may reveal our character, but in the end, who we become in Christ is what will remain. And on the day of judgment, Christ will ask us how much we love, not how much we had: "Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these my brothers and sisters, you did it to me" (Matthew 25:40). Let us make the shift while our time remains.

Inspiring Stories from American Catholic Saints

Fr. Junípero Serra, born in Spain in 1713, was a Franciscan priest who heard the call to become a missionary. After arriving in 1749, he served the native peoples of Mexico and California until his death in 1784. He is known as the "Apostle of California" due to the significant work he did there, founding 21 missions in the state, many of which have become well-known cities today. He baptized and confirmed thousands of Native Americans, also teaching them European farming and ranching methods, as well as Spanish arts and crafts.

Pope John Paul II beatified Fr. Serra in 1988 after meeting with Native American leaders and defending him against critics' allegations of ancestral abuse. He praised Fr. Serra as "an

exemplary model of the selfless evangelizer; a shining example of Christian virtue and the missionary spirit." Not many of his writings exist, but those that do mainly condemn the excesses of the Spanish authorities. Fr. Serra presented a memorandum to the Viceroy outlining 32 points regarding the mistreatment of Native Americans and ways to improve their situation.

Pope Francis canonized St. Junípero Serra on September 23, 2015, at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington, DC. (This was one of only three canonizations by him that did not take place in Vatican City.) Let us all try to emulate St. Serra's love for the people he worked with by becoming selfless evangelizers to those we love.

A Modern Saint

Did you hear? Blessed Carlo Acutis, the first millennial saint, is scheduled to be canonized on September 7! Here is a brief biography, provided by the Archdiocese of Detroit, that will serve as an introduction to this modern, media-loving teenager with a deep devotion to the Eucharist:

Blessed Carlo Acutis was born on May 3, 1991, in London and eventually moved to Milan, Italy. While his family was not particularly religious at the time, Carlo demonstrated a great interest in Catholic churches from a young age. He was commonly observed praying before and after Mass at the Tabernacle. He also went to Confession weekly. He enjoyed visiting Assisi and the tomb of St. Francis.

In addition to his love for the Church, Carlo, like other kids his age, loved playing video games and soccer. He was deeply interested in computers and taught himself how to code and build websites for Catholic organizations. His most popular website, which listed Eucharistic miracles from around the world based on a catalog he had compiled since age 11, was completed shortly before his death.

Carlo was also known to give away his pocket money to the poor, to speak up in defense of the disabled, and he had a habit of inviting kids whose parents were divorcing to his house to support them. When Carlo developed leukemia as a teenager, he offered up his suffering for Pope Benedict XVI and the Church. He said, "I offer all the suffering I will have to suffer for the Lord, the Pope, and the Church." As part of his devotion, Carlo asked his parents to take him to various Eucharistic shrines, although his declining health

made travel increasingly difficult. Carlo died on October 12, 2006, at age 15.

Exactly four years to the day after his death, his mother gave birth to twins, which she attributed to her son's intercession. She also said her son has appeared to her in dreams foretelling his canonization.

Carlo Acutis was named a "Servant of God" in 2013. A miracle was attributed to him in November of 2019, when a young boy born with a pancreatic defect was miraculously cured. Pope Francis announced the beatification of Carlo Acutis while visiting Assisi in 2020. In 2024, his intercession was attributed to a second miracle—a 21-year-old Costa Rican girl was healed from a serious head injury after a bicycling accident in Italy. He will be canonized on September 7, 2025.

Crime Prevention for Seniors

Senior citizens represent the fastest-growing segment of the U.S. population. One in every eight Americans is 65 or older, totaling 35 million across the country. By 2030, as life expectancy increases, this number is expected to rise to 64 million.

As we age, our bodily functions decline, and we become less capable of defending ourselves and projecting confidence. Some seniors may begin to show signs of mental impairment, dementia, or Alzheimer's disease, which may predispose them to people who might take advantage of them.

There are numerous ways seniors can be taken advantage of, so it's essential to be aware of these risks. Seniors can become victims of elder abuse (physical, psychological, or financial), as well as neglect by family members, nursing home staff, or others known to them. Because seniors often possess significant financial resources, they are frequently targeted by fraud and scams via telemarketing, mail, the internet, home improvement schemes, door-to-door salespeople, and identity theft.

Scams target seniors for several reasons. Older Americans often own their homes, have excellent credit, and have saved for retirement.

Seniors also tend to trust other people and are less likely to report scams because they don't know who to contact, are too embarrassed, or are unaware that they have been scammed.

Seniors should be aware of safety precautions at home, in the car, while shopping, and in public. Family members can help ensure the safety of seniors by checking in on them regularly through daily phone calls, emails, or text messages. Seniors should also discuss any unusual calls, emails, texts, or visits from strangers they may have received. Additionally, establish an emergency plan, such as a safety alert button, in case a loved one falls or needs assistance. Other safety precautions include:

Personal Safety:

- When someone knocks on your door, do not open it unless you know who it is.
- If you return home and the door is ajar, call the police and do **not** go inside.
- Have good locks and a deadbolt.
- Don't carry a large amount of cash.
- Use direct deposit instead of mailed checks.

Telephone/Internet Safety:

- Don't have a conversation with an unknown caller.
- Don't give personal identification information over the phone. The IRS, banks, police, and other institutions do not call and ask for personal information. If someone solicits this information, hang up.
- If a phone call is threatening, hang up and call 911.
- Be aware of scams that claim you've won a prize and need to submit payment.
- Be careful with emails and texts. Do not respond or open attachments unless you have

definitively verified the sender.

Home Improvement Schemes:

 Avoid home improvement schemes, including those made door-to-door, via telephone calls, or advertised on the internet.

Health Fraud:

- Avoid "instant cures" or gadgets that claim to relieve pain, as promoted on TV, online, or in the newspaper.
- Avoid fake or "free" laboratory tests.

General Fraud Recommendations:

- Avoid get-rich-quick schemes.
- Read contracts before signing.
 Don't skip fine print or leave blank sections.
- Review bills for errors, additions, and services you did not use.
- Contributions to charity should be made to an organization, not an individual.

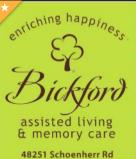

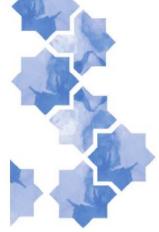
