HOW CAN I STAY READY SO I DON'T HAVE TO GET READY?

In this Sunday's Gospel (Luke 12:32-48), Jesus tells His disciples, "Be ready, for the Son of Man will come at an hour you do not expect." He compares this attentiveness to servants awaiting their master's return from a wedding, urging them to stay vigilant.

We've all heard the hypothetical: "If you knew that you had 24 hours left to live, what would you do?" The answers usually involve bucket-list traveling, spending time with loved ones, or mending broken relationships. (You probably won't hear someone respond with "Go to work" or "Watch Netflix!") And

while some people who are near death choose to reconcile with God through prayer, forgiveness, or even baptism, the truth is: We don't get a heads-up. As Scripture reminds us, we don't know the day or the hour.

That means there's no time for last-minute scrambling. Being ready

How can I stay ready so I don't have to get ready?

isn't just about the end of time; it's about how we live every day. A life of readiness is a life marked by prayer, purpose, kindness, and integrity.

I start most mornings around 6 AM with a workout on Apple Fitness+. It's early and not always easy, but it's part of my rhythm, and I'm always much more prepared to hit the day afterward. I don't wait to feel out of shape before I act. One of the trainers, Jamie-Ray, often says, "Stay ready so you don't have to get ready." That line has always stuck with me—not just because it sounds cool but because it reflects a

principle I've built into my life.

Faith is the same way. Praying, being kind, and living intentionally shouldn't wait until the eleventh hour; these things should be part of our daily rhythms.

Living "ready" means staying connected to God in the ordinary, everyday moments—not just when things fall apart. So, instead of wondering what you would do with only one day left, maybe a better question to ask yourself is: What can I start doing today to stay ready in mind, body, and spirit?

OKTOBERFEST

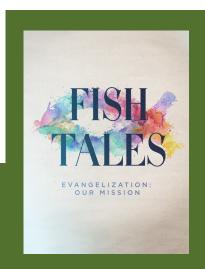

Inspiring Stories from American Catholic Saints

St. Katharine Drexel was born into a wealthy Philadelphia family in 1858 and learned from her father that money was meant to be shared with others. After inheriting her wealth in 1885, she began building schools, providing food and clothing, and paying the salaries of Native American teachers. She then extended this charity to African Americans. In 1891, she founded the religious order of the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament, taking four vows: poverty, chastity, obedience, and the unique fourth: "to be a servant of [Native] and [Black] races."

Over the course of her lifetime, which lasted almost 100 years, she donated over \$21 million to establish churches, schools, and hospitals in the USA. She founded Xavier University in New Orleans—the only Catholic African American

college in the country. She fought for civil rights, confronting the Ku Klux Klan and providing financial support to the NAACP.

She was known for investing her money and her life in what she truly believed in, and she was canonized by St. John Paul II on October 1, 2000. St. Katharine Drexel drew her spiritual strength from her devotion to the Eucharist. Through her adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, she discovered how to surrender herself totally to God. Part of her favorite prayer was, "Let the doing of your will each moment be a spiritual communion. In it, you will give me yourself, I will give you myself." This is a beautiful prayer that we can all share.

Soon-To-Be Saint

Last week, I featured a brief introduction to Blessed Carlo Acutis, the first millennial saint, who is scheduled to be canonized on September 7. This week, I'll introduce you to the young man who will also be canonized the same day: Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati. The U.S. Bishops' website shares the following short biography about Blessed Pier Giorgio:

For years, Blessed Pier Giorgio
Frassati (1901-1925) has been a
significant global patron for youth,
young adults, athletes, and "ordinary
people"—and holds a special place
in the hearts of many young people
across the United States and around
the world. His example of Gospel
living continues to inspire people a
century after his death.

St. John Paul II declared him a patron

for World Youth Davs and deemed him the "Man of the Beatitudes." as he exemplified those blessings in his everyday life. Pope Francis listed him (CV 60) among the twelve exemplary saints for all young people in his apostolic exhortation, Christus Vivit: "who devoted their lives to Christ... precious reflections of the young Christ; their radiant witness encourages us and awakens us from our lethargy" (CV 49). Pope Francis echoed St. John Paul II by noting that Frassati "was a young man filled with a joy that swept everything along with it, a joy that overcame many difficulties in his life" (CV 60).

Frassati was considered extraordinary in his "ordinariness" and is a great role model for "ordinary people" who strive to live their everyday lives to the fullest.

Pier Giorgio was engaged in the life of the Church through regular worship and Adoration, service to the poor and marginalized, advocacy for social justice for the disenfranchised and religious liberty, regular participation in student and sports activities, devotion to his family, and joyful companionship with his friends and fellow Catholics in his community. He saw many parallels between Catholic life and his favorite pastime, mountain climbing. He would regularly organize trips into the mountains with his close friends, often accompanied by occasions for prayer, liturgies, and conversations about faith on the way up to or down from the summit.

After what would become his final climb, he wrote a simple note on a photograph: "Verso L'Alto", which means "to the heights." This

Did You Eat Your Breakfast?

Why is breakfast so important?
Breakfast boosts your metabolism and helps burn calories throughout the day. It also provides energy and aids memory and concentration. In addition, breakfast helps lower "bad" (LDL) cholesterol and reduces the risk of diabetes, heart disease, and being overweight.

Skipping breakfast can throw off your body's rhythm of fasting and eating. When you wake up, the blood sugar your body needs to function optimally is usually low. When you skip breakfast, your body doesn't receive the necessary nutrients from food, so you may not have enough energy to get through the day, and you will be more likely to overeat later in the day because you are so hungry!

Although some of us might like a donut, a bagel loaded with cream cheese, or a calorie-laden coffee drink, these aren't the best for you. Just as it is important to eat breakfast, it is equally important to eat a **nutritious** breakfast. Breakfast is an opportunity to intake vitamins and nutrients from healthy foods, such as dairy, grains, and fruits.

Many people skip breakfast because they are in a hurry to get out the door; big mistake! Your body needs food before lunchtime! If you don't eat anything, you are more likely to snack on high-fat and high-sugar foods. Studies have also found that, on average, people who eat breakfast are thinner than those who don't. That could be because eating protein and fiber in the morning helps keep you feeling fuller during the day. If you are trying to lose weight, don't skip breakfast! Studies show that most people who lose weight and keep it off eat breakfast every day. However, it is equally important to pay attention to what and how much you eat; one study showed that people who ate large breakfasts consumed more throughout the day.

If you have kids, it's essential that they eat breakfast in the morning in order to fuel their growing bodies. When kids don't eat, they may become cranky and restless, have a harder time focusing, and become tired at school. Studies show that kids who eat breakfast have higher test scores than those who don't.

Additionally, children who skip breakfast are more likely to eat junk food throughout the day and are at a higher risk of being overweight. It has been shown that teenagers who ate breakfast every day had a lower body mass index (BMI) (a measure of body fat based on height and weight) than teens who never—or only sometimes—ate breakfast.

If you find that your child won't eat before leaving the house in the morning, pack them a nutritious snack, such as fruit, nuts, a peanut butter sandwich, or a yogurt



smoothie, that they can eat/drink on the way to school or between classes.

So, try to eat something within an hour of waking up. It doesn't have to be a big meal, but it should consist of carbohydrates (which provide immediate energy), protein (which provides energy later on), healthy fats, and fiber (which helps you feel full). Try a whole-grain cereal, low-fat milk, fruit, or a breakfast smoothie made with low-fat yogurt, fruit, and a teaspoon of bran/oats. Nuts or whole-grain granola bars are also easy options if you don't want to make breakfast or eat something heavier.

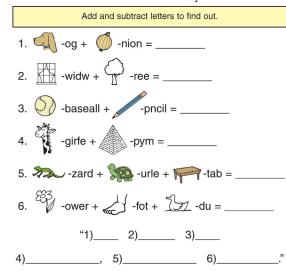

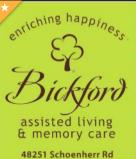

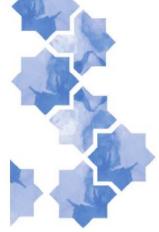
