

# CONNECTING POINT

"Would you consider coming to church with me this Sunday? We could grab coffee afterward and spend some time together. It would really mean a lot to me."

Inviting a loved one back to church, whether an adult or a child who has drifted away from the regular attendance they were raised with, can be one of the most emotionally difficult conversations we face. We fear rejection, awkwardness, or straining relationships with those we care deeply about. But this week's readings remind us that we're not alone in these challenges.

In the Gospel, Jesus speaks boldly about division, especially within families. The message of faith isn't always welcomed. He says, "Do you think I have come to establish peace on earth? No, but rather division" (Luke 12:51). That's not easy to hear, particularly when we long for harmony in our homes.

#### How do I prepare for tough conversations about faith?

However, it's a reminder that faith sometimes causes tension before it brings healing. Jeremiah knew this, too. He spoke the truth God gave him, even when it landed him in a muddy cistern. His courage didn't come from popularity; it came from knowing that he was being faithful. And in Hebrews (12:1), we're encouraged to "run with perseverance," keeping our eyes fixed on Jesus, who endured so much out of love for us.

So, how do we prepare for these tough conversations? Start with prayer and ask the Holy Spirit for a gentle heart and the right words. We must speak with humility—not judgment, remembering that conversion is God's work, not ours.

When you feel that nudge to talk to a family member who has drifted from the faith, don't brush it aside; God may be planting a seed through you. And even if the conversation is hard or the response cold, trust that your courage matters.

Loving someone enough to speak about what matters most isn't easy, but it's holy work—and you're not doing it alone.



## ▶ 2025 Teen Mission Trip Thank You

The 2025 Teen Mission Trip was a great success for our teens and the families of Pewaukee, WI, that we served. During the week-long trip, our group of 17 joined nearly 300 others from 16 church groups and seven states to form 50 work crews of 5–6 people, working on 40 home sites. In all, we completed 103% of the projects and 8,730 hours of service. Our group consisted of teens from all three churches in our Family of Parishes, as well as five other churches and schools.

## Inspiring Stories from American Catholic Saints

St. Isaac Jogues and the North American Martyrs are well-known as the Patron Saints of North America. They were all French Jesuits who worked among the Native Americans of the Great Lakes in the 1640s. (Fr. Jacques Marquette was assigned as a missionary to the same location in New France some 15 years later.) These eight missionaries were all canonized by Pope Pius IX in 1930.

In 1642, Fr. Jogues was captured and tortured by hostile Iroquois, who cut off his thumb and some of his fingers. After being enslaved by the chief for a year, he escaped and made his way to New York with the help of a Reformed minister. After sailing back to France, due to his courage, he was granted an exception by the pope to continue

saying Mass, even though his fingers had been mutilated and he was unable to hold the host correctly. He was viewed as a living martyr by many, Catholics and non-Catholics alike. Fr. Jogues demonstrated even more courage by returning to New France in 1646, where he was martyred later that year.

Fr. Jogues' life and death remind us of the great endurance he demonstrated in sharing the Gospel with others. This raises a question for each of us: "What keeps me from telling others about Jesus?" St. Isaac Jogues, pray for us.

## Chronic Obstructive Lung Disease

Chronic Obstructive Lung Disease (COPD) is a lung disorder that makes it hard to breathe. In the beginning stages, symptoms may be so mild that people may not notice and think they are simply "getting old." Over time, people with COPD may develop bronchitis and/or emphysema. However, if COPD is caught early, with proper care, people can stay healthy and active, slowing the progression of the disease.

COPD clogs the airways and damages the alveoli (balloon-like sacs) that absorb oxygen in the lungs. When this happens, you may experience fatigue, wheezing, chest tightness, frequent colds, shortness of breath while performing everyday activities, a persistent cough, and the production of a significant amount of mucus.

As COPD progresses, activities you usually do, such as walking, cleaning the house, or anything requiring effort, may become more difficult. You may experience more shortness of breath and produce more mucus. Swollen legs or feet, loss of muscle strength, morning headaches, and/ or blue or gray fingernails or lips are additional symptoms you may experience as the disease gets worse.

If you suspect you may be experiencing any symptoms, schedule an appointment with your doctor. Your physician will ask if you have a family history of COPD and

whether you are or were a smoker. They may order a test to measure the amount of oxygen in your blood, a chest x-ray, and a breathing test (spirometry), which measures how much air you can move in and out of your lungs and how quickly you can do it.

Once the tests are complete, your physician will determine if you have COPD and develop a treatment plan for you. You may require medications, pulmonary rehabilitation, oxygen therapy, or other treatments, depending on your specific condition.

If you have COPD, there are things you can do to help manage your illness. Try to stay active, and pace yourself while doing so. If you stay active, you will make yourself stronger. Walking is one of the most beneficial activities. Start with just 5-10 minutes at a time, three to five days each week. If you can walk without stopping, add another minute or two. Even if you have severe COPD, you may be able to walk 30 minutes at a time. If you are on oxygen therapy, use your oxygen while walking. Make sure to consult your physician before starting an exercise regimen.

If you are a smoker, it is critical to stop smoking. Smokers with COPD lose lung function faster than nonsmokers. Quitting will slow/stop the damage of the disease, becoming one of the most important steps you can take. By quitting, you will also lower your risk of heart disease.

A healthy diet is also important for people with COPD. Being overweight can make it harder to breathe, and being underweight can make you weak. Drink 6–8 glasses of water or non-caffeinated beverages daily, eat high-fiber foods, avoid gassy foods, and opt for 4–6 small meals per day instead of larger ones.

Additionally, avoid those who smoke and other lung irritants, get the flu and pneumonia vaccines, avoid sick people, and wash your hands frequently. Doing all of these things will help you manage your disease and lead a healthy and productive life




